NOTICE OF WARNING

We have an investigative case report showing that you violated the North Carolina Compulsory Meat Inspection Law. This reported violation was discussed with you on August 2, 2011. Specifically, our investigation revealed that you had stored, offered for sale and/or sold three (3) packages of seasoned pork, nine (9) packages of beef leg bones, six (6) packages of beef stomachs, six (6) packages of beef steaks, two (2) packages of pork chops and two (2) packages of Mexican style pork sausage, which did not contain State (NCDA) or Federal (USDA) marks of inspection or required labeling, to the general public. You stated in a signed statement dated August 2, 2011 that you had been offering for sale and selling the above mentioned misbranded meat products to the general public for approximately one week.

Please be advised that the sale of misbranded and/or uninspected meat products is a violation of North Carolina General Statute (N.C.G.S.) §106-549.23 with civil and/or criminal penalties. Please be advised that you will not receive any further warning with regard to this violation. If you should continue to sell misbranded and/or uninspected meat products, we will pursue legal action against you to invoke the penalties associated with these continued violations. I certainly hope this expensive action will not be necessary. An officer from this department will visit you periodically to verify compliance.
