In North Carolina, a farmer can shoot deer doing crop damage 365 days a year, day or night. No permit required, cannot possess deer. Legal . . . but not what I recommend.

Farmers can easily obtain a depredation permit that allows them to name a secondary shooter in addition to themselves to shoot deer doing damage to their crops. Edible portions of the deer can be consumed with a permit by the shooter, and starting in 2010, the shooter can give the meat to anyone to eat. Permits are easier to obtain now than ever before and larger numbers of deer to be harvested can be listed on the permit. If a season is in, the permit must be approved in Raleigh, but it is still obtainable.
