


Fresh Food Access in our Region

Summary

- ❑ 125,200+ households (17%) are in food deserts or limited supermarket access areas*
- ❑ 19,000+ households (3%) receive food assistance *and* are located in a food desert
- ❑ There are 35 seasonal or year-round farmers markets in our region

*NOTE: The USDA identifies food deserts in low- to moderate-income areas where supermarkets or full service grocery stores are more than 1 mile away (10 miles in rural areas). The Reinvestment Fund (TRF) defines Limited Supermarket Access Areas with a more detailed formula including food consumption data, car ownership & other factors to help determine rural food access issues.
