Situation Report for Operational Period: 6 PM, 9-18-03 - 6AM, 9-19-03

A. OPERATIONS:

- Tasked location, capacity and operational status of rendering facilities and landfills to Logistics for use by field operations and mortality/disposal branches.
- Received maps for poultry and swine producers and posted on Operations Board.
- Monitored email for ops.crc@ncmail.net and multi-hazard account.
- Established notebook for reference material for staff at telephone table.
- Established folders to facilitate submitting IAP and situation reports to Planning Chief.
- Redefined Food Assessment branch into two parallel sub-branches: one for meat and poultry (Steven Wells) and one for other products (Don Howell).
- Initiated backing up old tasks in new task tracker.

Field Operations:

- Prepared documentation to track/coordinated field assessment teams.

Sheltering:

Bertie: 100% blackout. Animals ok for now, may need food if power is not returned soon. Contact the local emergency hotline at 252-794-6370

Dare Majority of County without power; curfew in place. {County Animal Response Team is accepting companion animals at the animal shelter in Manteo}. Contact Lori Brazell at 252-256-1696

Green Neil Barrow with NC Forest Service, 252-747-2544, reported lots of power outages, downed lines. No animal needs at this time. Will assess Friday morning.

Johnston Power lines down, but shelter has power. {County Animal Response Team has set up temporary sheltering for horses in conjunction with the North Carolina Equine Rescue League. Contact Melanie Barnes at 919-894-5835. Proof of current negative Coggins test is required.}

Lenoir Some power outages. {County Animal Response Team has set up a temporary animal shelter for both livestock (but not horses) and companion animals at Kinston Livestock Arena. Contact Eva Honeycutt at 252-521-3745}

New Hanover Minimal Damage. {County Animal Response Team are accepting companion animals at the New Hanover County Animal Services shelter on 180 Division Drive, Wilmington. Contact Jean McNeil/Daisy Brown- at 910-341-4197 x209

Wayne Scattered trees down in area and power outages noted. Number of animals was same (not noted). Contact Eileen Coite at 919-588-0025 or Wayne Co. Cooperative Extension office at 919-731-1525. No needs as this time.

B. LOGISTICS:

- Provided Planning Section an electronic copy of emergency operating instructions.

- Evaluated need for veterinary support to Urban Search and Rescue mission requested by Dare County for Outer Banks. NCEM Emergency Services indicated there was no need at this time because search dogs would not be assigned to the mission.
- Communicated with Dr. Mark Comacho at NCEM EOC regarding aerial assessment mission scheduled for midday on 9-19-2003 to determine if Civil Air Patrol could fulfill the mission needs since helicopters are being exclusively assigned for search and rescue.
- Updated NCDA&CS Tracker List for Logistics.
- Disconnect Number 2 generator and send mission notification to NCEM indicating the generator is available for reassignment.
- Review Logistic.Crc messages and assure requests are met.

C. PLANNING:

- Assisted in completion of IAP/SITREP for 9/18/03, 6AM-6PM Operations Period
- Completed IAP/SITREP for 9/18/03-9/19/03, 6 PM-6 AM Operations Period. **NOTE:** Standardized reporting format for each Section's use developed by Operations and located at H:emergency\Isabel/IAP Reporting, has made compilation of IAP and SITREP more effective, efficient and much less time intensive.

- Monitored plans email account for incoming messages.
- Updated staffing organization Charts for Teams 2 for inclusion in IAP
- Developed Incident Timeline reflecting briefings, command meetings, and shift changes
- Task to continue Development of tracking system for total costs incurred by all agencies, overtime hours worked, regular work hours, and expenses—referred to Finance Section

- Spreadsheet has been developed for tracking Isabel regular time and Isabel overtime.
- Regular and over-time Information has been entered for all 204 forms that have been received to date.
