Division Sit Rep

Food & Drug

- 6 Division employees reporting work activities. Total man-hours – 29 Total mileage ----559
- 3 Food inspectors conducted field investigations in the 5 following impacted counties: Bertie, Camden, Chowan, Pasquotank, Perquimans
- 24 total food firms visited
20 retail grocery/convenience stores
2 retail/wholesale seafood processors
2 other (peanut processors, retail/wholesale bakeries)
Estimated dollar value of product and facility losses is \$665,900.
Losses attributed to power failure.
- Field investigations winding down
- Forwarded NCDA&CS Human health, commodity and environmental concerns relative to proposed NALED/Dibrom spraying to Public Health Pest Management for assessment and comments.
- Revised Q&A fact sheet on NALED/Dibrom for possible web-posting

Food Distribution

- No new issues to report, standing down at EOC

Livestock

- Able to complete all cattle sales in eastern part of the State, in excess of 3000 head of cattle. No additional cattle sales are scheduled.

Marketing

- Currently in contact with commodity associations to access harvesting needs and capacity. With have report in 24 hrs

- Soybeans, cotton, peanuts
 - Northampton 9 of 10 farmers need assistance with cutting & removing debris
 - Other counties unreported. However they have same crops, and were harder hit by the hurricane. Thus assume needs are equal or greater than Northampton County

SART

- So far we have had donations from: Cargill (horse pellets), Happy Jack (dog food), Pets Plus (dog food), Pitt Co Animal Shelter (rabies vaccines), East Carolina Vet Services (Bordatella vaccines and various vet meds), Food Lion (dried and canned dog food), Marley Fund (FELV/FIV combo test kits), Purina (hay and cat and dog food) and Southern States (hay and horse pellets).
- **As of yesterday evening we have begun to deliver initial supplies and to partially fulfill requests from veterinarians in Pasquotank County, Bertie County, Dare County and Hyde County.**
- As of lunchtime Wednesday 9/24, we have received one additional request for supplies in Gates County.
- We have more supplies going out over the next few days to fulfill the requests received, as we continue to receive supplies into our distribution center in Greenville.

State Fair

- No animals remain at state fairgrounds because of hurricane

B. LOGISTICS:

- Updated Task Tracer List for Logistics Section.
- Monitored staffing needs from all sections on an on going basis.
- Monitored task tracker with all Sections and SART to assure tasks are getting entered.
- Monitored the Logistics e-mail box.
- Added to Communications Plan and requested input from all sections.
- Monitored the EM2000, CRC phones, and fax.
- Continue preparing orders for replacement supplies and equipment.
- Researched requests for pumps, generators, debris removal, crop loss compensation, and portable office space.
- Assisted with power upgrades in CRC-IS area.
- Completed weigh scale maps and reports for NC EM including Beaufort, Hertford, Northampton and Pender.
- Developed and implementing web based After Action Report for Hurricane Isabel feedback.
- Coordinating with both NC EM and FEMA for GIS tax parcel data for 26 local counties that have been declared disaster counties.
- Developing and building Emergency Response Notification system Version 2.

- Developed wind gust and precipitation GIS data to NC EM.
- Distribute Incident reports as requested.
- Totaled the number of tasks on the Task Tracker. **Total number of tasks entered: 446. Total number of tasks completed 431_.**
