On the Horizon

The Oxford Research Station will celebrate 100 years of agricultural research this year. The station joins three others that have reached this milestone – the Upper Coastal Plain Research Station in Rocky Mount, Piedmont Research Station in Salisbury and the Mountain Research Station in Waynesville.

North Carolina has a long history of agricultural research success from the 18-station system, which operates under a unique partnership between N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, N.C. State University and N.C. A&T State University.

During the past 100 years, the Oxford station has served as the premier tobacco research station, supporting a crop that through the years has laid a foundation for growth for the state.

A celebration event will be held later this year.

Boll weevil assessment drops to 70 cents per acre

The board of the Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation of North Carolina has set the boll weevil assessment for 2012 at 70 cents per acre of cotton. That amount is 30 cents less than the 2011 assessment.

The fee supports the foundation's efforts to monitor cotton acreage for any re-introduction of the boll weevil, which was eradicated in the state in 1986, and to respond promptly with eradication treatments if necessary.

"With stable or increasing cotton acreage, farmers will certainly want to maximize their cotton yields this year," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "The boll weevil assessment is an excellent investment. We don't want a return of this highly destructive pest in North Carolina, and the trapping and monitoring supported by this assessment

North Carolina food and beverages from nearly 100 producers will take center stage at the N.C. Food and Wine Expo, one of the highlights of the festival. Visitors can sample a variety of products and purchase some to take home. Cookbook signings will be a new addition to the Expo this year. Cost for the food and wine expo is \$2 and includes a discount coupon sheet for select products at the show.

Manage strawberry fertilization with tissue testing

Strawberry fertilization has begun in the coastal and piedmont regions of North Carolina. Fruit quality and yield will depend on how well nutrients are managed from now until harvest.

"Plant tissue analysis from the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services provides the most accurate way to monitor strawberry nutrition and adjust fertilizer rates," said Agriculture Commissioner

Steve Troxler.

The department recommends that growers submit strawberry tissue samples every two weeks throughout the bloom and fruiting stages. The test costs \$7 per sample for North Carolina growers and \$27 for out-of-state growers. It normally takes two working days for the department's Agronomic Services Division laboratory to measure nutrient levels in each sample and post test

results and recommendations online at www.ncagr.gov/agronomi/uyrplant.htm.

Strawberry tissue samples should contain only most recently mature, trifoliate leaves (MRMLs). These leaves are full-sized and green and consist of one petiole (leaf stalk) with three leaflets. They are usually located three to five leaves back from the growing point.

Avoid collecting leaves that are damaged or dull in

color.

When MRMLs are being collected, it is very important to detach the petiole from the leaflets immediately. This action halts nutrient transfer between the two plant parts, which will be analyzed separately for different purposes. Analysis of leaflets can reveal nutrient imbalances within the plant. Analysis of petioles indicates the

Many restaurants now are proudly highlighting local foods on the menu, making it easier to support North Carolina agriculture when eating out. Don't know where to start? -- Look for local products in grocery stores and food retailers across the state. Many stores feature a North Carolina section, where local products are grouped. In addition, stores may feature a display with a farmer's photo and a description about his farm during special promotions. Look for the Got to Be NC logo on products. -- Attend the Got to Be NC Festival and visit the Food and Wine Expo. Around 100 North Carolina food and beverage businesses will participate, making it a great place to sample a lot of products in one place. The festival is coming up May 18-20.

amount of soil nitrogen currently available for crop growth and development, and serves as a basis for the nitrogen rate recommendation.

Each sample should include MRMLs from 20 to 25 plants randomly selected within a uniform area. For example, all of the plant material in a single sample should be the same variety, growing on the same soil type, planted at the same

time and having the same management history. This is known as a representative sample.

For accurate recommendations, the Agronomic Services Division asks growers to provide specific information about each crop sample. Details about fertilization history, environmental conditions and the name of the variety being grown should be written on the NCDA&CS "Plant Sample Information"

form, which is available on the division's website. On the form, it is especially important to indicate the appropriate growth-stage code (B1 through B12) based on the week of bloom.

David Dycus, an NCDA&CS regional agronomist based in Sanford, said it is important that growers have an overall understanding of fertilization strategy to use tissue analysis effectively. Growers who want to

initiate a sampling program are encouraged to contact their NCDA&CS regional agronomist for guidance.

helps ensure any spot re-introductions of boll weevils are quickly dealt with."

Foundation contractors will install and monitor traps from late summer until after harvest and frost. Because the focus of North Carolina's program has shifted from eradication to monitoring, farmers should anticipate the number of traps in fields will decrease. As such, each trap

will be critical, and farmers are encouraged to contact the foundation if traps are damaged or knocked down.

Given an increase in cotton acreage last year, just over 13,000 traps were placed and maintained in North Carolina, with each trap monitoring an average of 61 acres. Farmers in 55 counties grew 798,342 certified acres of cotton last year. The

top three cotton-growing counties were Edgecombe, Halifax and Bertie.

To allow for trapping and monitoring, cotton growers are required to certify cotton acreage information with their local U.S. Farm Service Agency office by June 30. For more, go to <http://www.ncagr.gov/plantindustry/plant/entomology/BW.htm>

NCDA&CS offers Specialty Crop Grants

Application deadline is April 20

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is offering grants to nonprofit and government agencies aimed at enhancing the competitiveness of specialty crops in the marketplace. The Specialty Crop Block Grant Program is managed by the NCDA&CS and funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture under the 2008 farm bill.

"Last year, the department awarded more than \$1.1 million to fund 22 projects that supported specialty crops across North Carolina," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "This program goes a long way to help small farmers stay competitive and grow more profitable crops." NCDA&CS will accept grant applications starting at \$10,000 from nonprofit organizations, commodity associations, state and local government agencies, colleges and universities.

Grants are not available for projects that directly benefit or provide a profit to a single organization, institution or individual. The application deadline is 5 p.m. April 20.

Projects involving the following specialty crops are eligible: fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, culinary herbs and spices, medicinal plants, as well as nursery, floriculture and horticulture crops. Funding is also available for projects aimed at developing local and regional food systems and improving food access.


