Happy New Year to all of our *Agricultural Review* subscribers. It is hard to believe how quickly another year rolls around, but I can tell you I am looking forward to continuing to serve as your Agriculture Commissioner.

With the current economic climate, we certainly have our work cut out for us this year and beyond. I'm not sure anyone has a real good handle on what will happen with the economy or when things will turn around, but I hope we see some relief before too long. Realistically, I know we are going to have to tighten our belts like everyone else, and we have already begun that process.

Overall, the NCDA&CS budget is less than one-half of one percent of the total state budget. Right now Gov. Mike Easley has ordered state agencies to revert 5 percent of their budgets in anticipation of the weakening economy. That could increase to 7 or 10 percent, and we can expect many of these cuts to be permanent for the foreseeable future.

We will be looking for ways to do more with less, but I hope that budget cuts won't result in a loss of agricultural and consumer programs and services. I believe the work we do is important in supporting agriculture in this state and in protecting consumers on many levels.

In an effort to reduce costs now, we will be implementing some changes in the *Agricultural Review* in the coming months as part of our overall belt tightening. Please see the editor's note on the front page outlining the details of these changes.

Farmland protection catching on in N.C.

Haywood County is the latest to adopt protection plan

With North Carolina's population growing rapidly, counties are taking steps to make sure they balance development with protecting natural resources and farmland.

Two-thirds of North Carolina's counties have established Voluntary Agricultural Districts, a planning tool that provides recognition of farming in communities.

And in November, Haywood County became the latest county to approve a farmland pro-

tection plan, joining Alamance, Buncombe, Cabarrus and Polk. Plans for protecting farmland are also in the works in 19 additional counties.

"Counties are recognizing that working lands are very important to our state's economy and environment," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "Farmland provides stability for local governments. New schools, roads, and fire and police protection go hand-in-hand with new development, whereas privately owned and managed farmland requires very few public services. Sur-

veys have shown that for every dollar in taxes received from working lands, local governments spend only 34 cents in services. That's a net gain for the county tax base."

A look at the state's Agricultural Development and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund provides ample evidence of interest in farmland protection by local governments and conservation groups. Last year, the trust fund received more than 90 applications requesting \$29 million for a variety of farmland protection efforts, even though only \$7.6 million

was available. After evaluating the applications, the trust fund awarded grants for 41 projects across the state.

"The trust fund couldn't fill every request, but we were able to boost efforts to protect some of North Carolina's most valuable resources and sustain its leading industry," Troxler said.

The General Assembly's appropriation to the trust fund for 2009 is smaller, \$4 million, but interest is still high. As of the Dec. 5 application deadline, the trust fund had received nearly 70 requests for \$15.5 million in grant assistance.

Paperless soil reports now a green option for users

The Agronomic Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services strongly encourages its clients to choose online reports for soil tests and other agronomic services instead of receiving paper copies by mail.

The division is reducing expenses to deal with an expected state budget shortfall. Because all of the division's agronomic reports are readily available online, the expense of printing and mailing paper copies to every client is no longer justifiable, said Dr. Colleen Hudak-Wise, director of agronomic services.

Agronomic reports are available electronically in a searchable database through the division's Web site, www.ncagr.gov/agronomi/. Report cover sheets and other explanatory notes that normally come in the mail with paper reports are also available online. Online reports can be obtained more quickly than mailed copies, and supplementary materials are always up-to-date, Hudak-Wise said.

To opt out of receiving a paper report in the mail, customers must indicate that they don't need one. Customers should check the "Do Not Send a Report" box near the center of the page of most sample-information forms. If the form doesn't contain a box, then the

Beginning with the March issue, the *Agricultural Review* will no longer publish any ads for dogs, pot-bellied pigs or lawnmower.

Online tracking of soil samples offered

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Agronomic Division recently implemented a tracking system that will send clients an e-mail when the lab receives their soil samples.

Using this service is easy. Go to the division's Web site, www.ncagr.gov/agronomi/, follow the links to print a bar-coded address label, and tape it to the sample shipping package.

"Every year from December through March, our department receives hundreds of thousands of soil samples," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "The lab staff answers a steady stream of calls from folks who want to know if their samples have arrived. We hope the bar-code tracking system will ease customers' minds and

help them estimate when their reports might be available."

Troxler pointed out that sample processing does not begin right when samples arrive. Depending on how busy the lab is, it may be several days or weeks before analysis begins. The notification e-mail will provide a Web link where clients can check the estimated sample turnaround time based on the date of arrival.

The bar codes can be used on packages shipped through the U.S. Postal Service, by private carriers such as DHL, FedEx and UPS, or even by personal delivery. Although private carriers have their own bar-code system, packages have been known to be delivered to the wrong address and never show up at the lab. By having its own

bar-code system, NCDA&CS can provide an extra layer of accountability for its customers, Troxler said.

Bar-code labels can be used on shipments of any samples sent to the NCDA&CS Agronomic Division, including plant tissue, compost or waste, nutrient solution or source water, and nematodes. It is important, however, that multiple types of samples be packaged separately. All the samples within an individual shipping box should be of the same type.

Agrotips for January 2009

New Year's Resolution: Please elect NOT to receive agronomic reports in the mail!

Resolve to be green this year! Be sure to check the box located in the center of the sample information form to indicate that you do not need to receive a paper copy of your report in the mail. If your particular form does not have a check box, write a note in the margin.

Most everyone has a computer these days and can easily visit www.ncagr.gov/agronomi/ to retrieve their soil-test and other agronomic reports as well as helpful explanatory materials. Please help the Agronomic Division reduce its printing and mailing costs!

Scout wheat early and plan to tissue test

Wheat producers need to count tillers in January and follow up with tissue sampling in late February or March. This approach is the best way to optimize fertilizer purchases and application at a time when prices are critically high. At the beginning of green-up in January, 50 to 70 tillers per square foot is optimum. If the count is lower, apply half the spring topdress nitrogen right away. This application will help the crop continue to produce tillers on warm days without excessive growth.

Tissue test in February or March (at Feekes growth stage 5 or Zadoks GS 30) to find out if more nitrogen is needed. Contact your regional agronomist if you need additional guidance on how to count tillers or identify the appropriate growth stage.

Ads in these categories submitted by noon on Jan. 1 will run in the February issue. No dog, pot-bellied pig or lawnmower ads will be accepted after Jan. 1.

In reviewing the small-animal listings, a good number of the dogs listed each month were described as pets, companions, hunters or show-quality animals. Few listings mentioned the work ability of the animals, and most dogs listed were puppies with no actual training in farm work. For those reasons, the decision was made to exclude dogs from the paper.

Likewise, lawnmowers are typically for residential use, not agricultural use, so we will no longer accept these either.

Also beginning with the March issue, we will strictly enforce the 30-word limit for ads. Advertisers are encouraged to pare their own ads down to 30 words before submitting the ads. If more than 30 words are submitted, we will edit the copy down to the appropriate number. The 30-word count includes name, town, telephone number and price.

One additional change is coming about because of new rules by the U.S. Postal Service. Beginning with the February issue, the location of a subscrib-

er's mailing label will shift from the right side of the page to the left side. The front page will undergo a small redesign to accommodate this change. The Commissioner's column will move to the bottom of the page, and a shorter column on the left side of the paper will be a place for upcoming events or messages of interest from the editor.

The address label shift will allow the *Agricultural Review* to be processed by automated machines, hopefully ensuring quicker delivery of the newspaper. In the near future, a bar code will be added on the mail label that will allow each paper to be tracked through the postal system. There is no additional cost for this tracking service, but it is expected to speed the processing and, ultimately, the delivery of the paper.

We will continue to evaluate all items submitted to the *Agricultural Review* for their agricultural purpose and may make other changes as needed. Because of the ongoing budget situation, we may be forced to implement other changes to the newspaper as needed.

We appreciate your understanding during this difficult budget time.

GLOBAL GAP certification funding offered through grant

Information session to be held Jan. 15 in Goldsboro on the program

The Golden LEAF Foundation has extended its grant to the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to fund the GLOBAL Good Agricultural Practices certification process for eligible farmers.

GLOBALGAP certification, formerly known as EUREGAP, is the standard used to determine if a supplier is qualified to sell to most major European grocery chains. The certification is also used as a base for other export certifications around the world.

"The grant will benefit North Carolina growers who are interested in extending their sales to international markets. We have seen growth in exports of N.C. agricultural products since start-

ing this certification program, and we want to see that continue," said Agriculture Com-

missioner Steve Troxler. "The number of paid certifications is limited, so I hope that farmers will apply early to take advantage of this opportunity."

The 2009 crop-year award is for produce crops. NCDA&CS will begin collecting applications immediately, with a Feb. 28 deadline. Participants will be selected based on a number of factors, including export potential.

An information session on Global GAP Certification will be held Jan. 15 at 1:30 p.m. at

the Wilson Ag Center in Goldsboro. The session, sponsored by the N.C. Sweet Potato Commission and the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, will give growers an overview of the requirements to become Global GAP certified.

"Golden LEAF is pleased to help North Carolina farmers become more competitive in today's global marketplace," said Dan Gerlach, president of the Golden LEAF Foundation. "Providing opportunity for growth is paramount to the success of a com-

petitive agriculture community."

GLOBALGAP is a different process than the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Good Agricultural Practices certification, meaning USDA GAP-certified farmers are not automatically GLOBALGAP-certified.

The goal of the GLOBALGAP certification project is to provide a competitive edge to North Carolina produce exporters in Europe and other international markets. GLOBALGAP is a certification adopted by a group of European retailers.

Farmers interested in exporting should contact the NCDA&CS to initiate the pre-certification process. A GLOBALGAP auditor will conduct an unofficial audit of the candidate's operations.

The audit feedback will help the candidate know what is specifically needed to become GLOBALGAP-certified. All information will remain confidential between the farmer and auditor.

customer may write a note in the margin requesting not to receive a mailed report.

The division mailed more than 56,000 reports last year. Often, copies of a single report were mailed separately to both a client and an adviser. "With computer access becoming more prevalent, more clients have the ability to print their own reports," Hudak-Wise said. "The division would prefer to mail paper copies only in cases of real necessity."

Clients who want help looking up their reports may call the division at (919) 733-2655.

Agronomic reports cannot be automatically e-mailed to clients now, but long-range plans to implement this feature are under way.

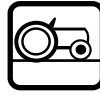

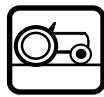
