On the horizon

Small Farms Week runs March 21-27

Each year a small farm in North Carolina is honored with the Gilmer L. and Clara Y. Dudley Small Farmer of the Year Award in recognition of Small Farms Week. The award will be presented March 24 at N.C. A & T State University in Greensboro.

Small Farms Week runs March 21-27 with events planned at the university.

This annual event is designed to recognize a farmer who exemplifies success, innovation and leadership in small-scale agriculture. Small farms are described as those with a net farm income of \$100,000 or less.

The 2009 Small Farmer of the Year was John L. Council Farms of Hoke County. The farm is owned by John L. Council, and includes Council's team of daughter Jacquie Rogers, Ted Smith and Paul Raymond.

The 68-acre farm produces pastured-raised hogs, chickens and turkeys, cows, goats and rabbits. The operation also produces hay and vegetables.

NCDA&CS offers price-risk management workshops

The North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services will host seven free price-risk management workshops across the state to help farmers better understand the futures market and other trading options to sell their commodities.

The series, "Managing Price Volatility by Using Futures and Options," features workshops conducted by NCDA&CS staff between Jan. 19 and March 4.

Topics to be covered include an introduction to grain hedging, basis trading, cost of carry, cotton

futures, energy derivatives, and options trading on futures, equities and indices. There will also be information on trading strategies to manage exposure to fluctuations in energy costs.

"The information covered in these workshops can help farmers improve their bottom line, which is critical in today's challenging economic climate," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "Farmers are encouraged to take advantage of these classes."

The workshops will be held

from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at each location, with an on-your-own lunch break. Registration is not required.

State Fair and Mountain State Fair honored by peers

The North Carolina State Fair recently won six awards from the International Association of Fairs and Expositions at the association's annual meeting in Las Vegas.

In addition, the N.C. Mountain State Fair won nine awards, including three first places.

The State Fair, which competes against other fairs with an attendance of 500,001 to 1 million, took home a first-place communications award for its Web site. The fair also won second-place honors for television commercial, third place for best use of social media and third place for black-and-white newspaper advertisement.

In the agricultural competition, the State Fair received second place in the new green program

category for its Green NC exhibit. The Got to Be NC Festival, which takes place on the State Fairgrounds in May, won second-place honors in the category for non-fair agricultural event or program.

The Mountain State Fair won two firsts in the agricultural competition for overall program for commercial agricultural exhibitors and for newly established or developed exhibit to promote agriculture. The fair also earned first for use of theme throughout competitive exhibits and new or unique strategy to increase the number of competitive exhibitors.

From the tractor

Every year, our Agricultural Statistics Division, working with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, releases a yearbook of statistical information on North Carolina agriculture.

There is a lot of information included in these books, including the amount of fertilizer materials shipped, farm real estate values, number of farms and land in farms, a breakdown on commodity statistics and agricultural cash receipts, along with a snapshot of the agricultural impact on a county-by-county basis. This collection of information gathered in 2008 makes a handy book and a great resource.

I wanted to share with you some of the numbers from this

year's book; things that show the impact of agriculture in this state along with our top commodities and the diversity of production.

North Carolina farmers had more than \$9.7 billion in income from the sale of crops, livestock and related products. That was up \$1 billion from 2007. It is important to note that this number does not factor in the agribusiness impact, it is solely cash receipts.

Of that, 66 percent of cash receipts came from the livestock sales, and 34 percent was from crops.


Not surprisingly then, our top two commodities were broilers -- with cash receipts of nearly \$2.7 billion -- and hogs at about \$2.2 billion.

Greenhouse, nursery and

floriculture represent the largest crop and third-largest commodity, with an income of \$777 million. Tobacco was the second-leading crop at \$687 million.

Not so long ago, tobacco was the leading commodity and was the primary crop produced in the state. Our farmers have diversified over the years, and while tobacco is still a significant industry, we now rank as the fourth most agriculturally diverse state in the country.

In fact, we rank in the top 10 nationally in 27 different commodities. We are first in tobacco and sweet potatoes, second in hogs, turkeys and Christmas trees. We rank third in processing cucumbers and trout sold and fourth in fresh market



cucumbers and strawberries.

Duplin, Sampson and Union counties are tops in agricultural production in the state. Duplin has more than \$968 million in cash receipts, Sampson has more than \$913 million and Union counts more than \$454

Twenty-one animal shelters reprimanded for failing to comply with state euthanasia standards

State regulators have started to enforce rules designed to ensure the humane euthanasia of animals at shelters across the state after a two-month grace period.

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services Animal Welfare Section has cited 21 animal shelters since beginning enforcement in September. The rules took effect in July. Some of the shelters have since come into compliance.

The SPCA of Wake County Inc. agreed to a \$500 civil penalty for euthanizing animals without a certified euthanasia technician on staff. The rules require anyone performing animal euthanasia to

undergo training and testing to ensure humane treatment. The SPCA of Wake County now has two CETs on staff.

The following facilities agreed to voluntarily stop using carbon monoxide chambers to euthanize animals because the chambers were either not commercially manufactured or did not meet the standards of the euthanasia rules at the time of inspection.

The following facilities were issued a warning letter and agreed to stop using carbon monoxide chamber until an inspection by the manufacturer, manufacturing representative or industrial hygienist was completed. These facilities have since been inspected and can use the chamber

according to humane treatment standards set forth by the rules:

Sweetpotato weevil exterior quarantine expanded

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services has established an exterior quarantine for Colleton County, S.C., because of the detection of the sweetpotato weevil in the county.

The quarantine prohibits the movement of sweet potatoes, roots, sweet potato plants (including ornamental plants), vines, and vines or roots of other plants belonging to the morning glory family, from Colleton County into North Carolina.

The quarantine is effective immediately.

Colleton becomes the fifth South Carolina county under exterior quarantine. The others are Beaufort, Charleston, Clarendon and Florence.

NCDA&CS officials expanded the quarantine after being notified that a single sweetpotato weevil had been detected in research plots in Colleton County.

“South Carolina continues to conduct statewide monitoring efforts for the sweetpotato weevil, and this information is very useful in evaluating potential risks to North Carolina’s sweet potato industry,” said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler.

“North Carolina remains the top producer of sweet potatoes in the country, with the 2008 crop valued at \$142 million. We must continue to protect this industry from potential introductions of this destructive pest.”

NCDA&CS officials expect the exterior quarantines for South Carolina will remain in effect until the sweetpotato weevil has been eradicated from the five counties.

Any potential violations of the exterior quarantine should be reported immediately to the NCDA&CS Plant Industry Division at (800) 206-9333.

Century Farm program is year-round initiative; farm owners can apply anytime

In 2010, the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services’ Century Farm Program will celebrate its 40th year – a milestone, but one significantly shorter than the program’s focus.

The program started in 1970 at the N.C. State Fair with a push to find and honor farms that had been in continuous family ownership for 100 years or more.

Newspaper articles across the state spread the word that there would be a celebration at the State Fair in Raleigh and these farm families would be invited.

That initial effort found more than 800 farms. Today there are roughly 1,600 in the program – an indication that it is still going strong.

The Public Affairs Division handles the paperwork and the event planning for the Century Farm reunions, and staff members get calls throughout the year about when and how people can apply

to have their farm included.

“Sometimes people think they can only send in an application in the years when we are holding a reunion, but that is not the case,” said Terri Allen, Century Farm Program manager. “We accept applications year-round, and are regularly adding farms.”

Applications to apply for Century Farm status can be found on the NCDA&CS Web site at <http://www.ncagr.gov/paffairs/century/index.htm>. That page includes the application, frequently asked questions, a short history of the Century Farm Program and a list of Century Farms listed by county.

“One of the most common questions we get asked is ‘Do I have to have paper documentation of continual ownership through courthouse records, deeds or the like,’” Allen said. “As long as there is a family record of the 100 years of ownership and how that

farm and land have been passed down through generations, we can accept it.”

Once an application is received, it can take several months to be processed. Families receive a Century Farm sign and certificate signed by the Governor, Commissioner of Agriculture and the State Fair manager, and the latest directory of Century Farm family listings.

“It is quite an accomplishment to keep a farm in a family for 100 years or more, and we are extremely proud of these families for their commitment,” said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. “Hosting the Century Farm families at the State Fair is one of the events I look forward to.”

Food safety workshop for small food producers, seafood processors is Jan. 26

Food entrepreneurs, seafood processors and others interested in preventing food recalls are encouraged to attend a Jan. 26 workshop sponsored by the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and other agencies.

“Preventing a Recall – Protecting Your Food Business” will take place from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Center for Marine Sciences and Technology in Morehead City.

The workshop is designed for small food entrepreneurs and producers who sell directly to the public, seafood processors and retailers, meat handlers producing and selling meat products, individuals interested in developing food recall plans to protect their businesses, and those who want to expand market outreach and are required to obtain liability insurance to enter new markets.

Topics to be covered include the economics of food recalls, lessons learned from the peanut products recall, and procedures for issuing a recall.

Following lunch, there will be a tabletop exercise where instructors will walk participants through the scenario of a Class I food recall.

The workshop is limited to 30 participants and the deadline to register is Jan. 19. Cost is \$30 and includes breakfast and lunch. Checks should be made to N.C. Ag Promotions Inc. 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More winning recipes from the N.C. State Fair

Whipped Nutella Cream Pie wins Pillsbury Pet-Ritz contest

Domino Ireland of Raleigh took the top prize in the Pillsbury Pet-Ritz Pie Baking Championship at the N.C. State Fair. Ireland's Whipped Nutella Cream Pie beat out 98 other competitors for the \$200 cash prize.

Judy Myklebust of Durham took home second place and \$100 for her Sour Cream Raisin Pie, and Shelley Gregory of Burlington took home third place and \$50 for her Bavarian Port Pear Pie.

Rules called for recipes to include one or two packages of Pillsbury Pet-Ritz frozen pie crusts. Any dessert-style pie could compete. Entries were judged on taste, appearance, creativity, ease of preparation and general appeal.

The winning recipe follows:

Whipped Nutella Cream Pie

- 1 Pillsbury Pet-Ritz pie crust
- 1 8-ounce package cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup Nutella
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- ¼ cup graham cracker crumbs
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- Dark and white chocolate for grated topping

Prepare one crust according to package directions and allow to cool. Beat cream cheese, Nutella and brown sugar together until smooth. Whip cream, then gently fold into Nutella mixture along with graham cracker crumbs. Spoon mixture into cooled crust and top with grated chocolate. Refrigerate before serving. For best results, place pie in the freezer until semi-frozen, then remove 10 to 15 minutes prior to serving so it softens slightly.

The winning first-place recipes follow:

Healthy Hearty Honey Wheat Oat Bread

- 1 ¼ cups warm water
- 4 teaspoons olive oil
- 1 ½ tablespoons honey
- 1 ½ teaspoons salt
- 1 ½ teaspoons Demerara or raw sugar
- 1 ¾ cups bread flour
- 1 cup whole wheat flour
- ¾ cup blended oatmeal
- 2 ½ teaspoons Fleischmann's Active Dry Yeast

Prepare bread machine for dough setting. To the bread pan, add warm water, olive oil, honey, salt, bread flour and whole wheat flour. Blend oatmeal to a fine powder, then add to other ingredients. Sprinkle yeast on top and let bread machine knead the dough. When kneading cycle is complete, remove dough from bread pan.

Divide into two portions and shape each into a loaf, kneading the dough slightly in the process. Place dough on baking sheet, cover and let rise for 45 minutes. Bake in a 375 degree oven for 18 minutes.

Cherry Almond Batter Bread

- 1 package Fleischmann's Active Dry Yeast Rapid Rise
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- ½ cup warm water
- 1, 12 ounce can evaporated milk
- 1 teaspoon pure almond extract
- ½ cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 2 tablespoons melted, unsalted butter
- 4 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup finely chopped cherries
- 1/3 cup sliced almonds

Glaze

- 1 tablespoon melted butter
- 1/3 cup powdered sugar
- ¼ teaspoon almond extract
- 1 ½ teaspoon cherry juice

In a small bowl, mix yeast, 1 tablespoon of sugar and warm water. Stir to dissolve and let sit about 10 minutes until foamy. In a large bowl, mix milk, ½ cup sugar, salt, butter, almond extract and 1 ½ cups flour using mixer's paddle attachment. Add the yeast mixture and beat for one minute, then add remaining flour by pouring in ½ cup at a time, mixing on low speed. When all ingredients are combined, beat on medium speed for two minutes. Add almonds and cherries and mix on slow speed. Pour dough into three, greased 5 x 3 inch loaf pans. Cover with plastic wrap and let loaf rise for 45 minutes to 1 hour, or until it has doubled in size. Bake in 350 degree oven for 30 to 45 minutes until done. Cover with foil if top of loaf gets brown. While still warm, pour glaze over bread.

Southern Ham and Bean Casserole is winner in the House-Autry Mills casserole cooking contest

Donna Barefoot's Southern Ham and Bean Casserole took top honors in the House-Autry Mills casserole recipe contest. Barefoot, of Benson, received \$250 for her winning entry.

Amanda Boury of Youngsville placed second and won \$100 with her Creamy Italian Chicken Casserole, and Janice Wolfe of Fuquay-Varina took third place and \$50 for an Eggplant Tomato Pasta Casserole.

Recipes were judged based on taste and flavor, creativity and ease of preparation.

Following is the winning recipe:

Southern Ham and Bean Casserole

- 1 package House-Autry Chicken Breeder
- 1 large sliced onion
- 3 tablespoons brown sugar
- 3 cans fancy string beans
- 1 jar roasted red peppers
- 6 ounces mushrooms, sliced
- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1 cup country cooked ham
- 4 ounces cream cheese
- 2 ounces goat cheese

Place breeder on bowl. *Sauté* onion in 3 tablespoons of olive oil and brown sugar. Drain, roll in breeder and set aside. Mix beans, peppers and mushrooms in casserole dish. Toss with 1 tablespoon of olive oil and 2 tablespoons of soy sauce. Roast 20 minutes at 375 degrees. Remove from oven and toss in ham and cheeses. Place onions on top and bake at 400 degrees for 8 minutes, until cooked through.

- 3 cups miniature marshmallows
- 10 ounces peanut butter chips
- 2/3 cup light KARO syrup
- ¼ cup margarine
- 2 cups lightly salted peanuts
- 1 cup Rice Krispies

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large mixing bowl, combine flour, sugar, margarine and eggs. Beat with a mixer on low speed until crumbly. Press into a foil lined 13x9x2-inch baking pan. Bake in preheated oven 12-15 minutes.

Remove from oven, sprinkle with marshmallows. Return to oven for 1-2 minutes, remove from oven and let cool.

To save costs, NCDA&CS moves to online soil tests and other agronomic reports

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services will no longer routinely mail out paper copies of agronomic reports. This policy, which went into effect Nov. 1, will apply to reports for soil tests and nematode assays, as well as plant tissue, waste, solution and soilless media analyses.

All these reports are readily available through the NCDA&CS Agronomic Division's Web site, www.ncagr.gov/agronomi.

"By making the switch to electronic-only reports, the NCDA&CS will work within its limited budget to save significantly on postage, printing and paper costs," said Dr. Colleen Hudak-Wise, director of the Agronomic Division. "Although environmental and fiscal benefits are driving this change, clients should also see increases in convenience and efficiency. Online reports are available to clients faster than mailed reports and make record keeping easier.

"Copies can be easily downloaded and saved, and the analytical data can be exported into spreadsheet format," Hudak-

Wise said.

Eventually, the NCDA&CS would like to notify all clients via e-mail when their reports are available online.

Clients who provide a valid e-mail address on their sample information form, or who register an e-mail address with the Agronomic Division online, can receive electronic notification. In the interim, all other clients will receive a postcard with instructions on how to find their reports.

Clients who visit the Agronomic Division home page should select the "Find Your Report" link from the left-column navigation bar. This link takes visitors into the division's laboratory-information site, known as PALS. For most people, using the "Quick Report Search" link is the most convenient way to access reports.

Basic instructions are outlined at www.ncagr.gov/agronomi/reportsearch.htm. Anyone who has difficulty using the PALS report-search feature or has questions can call (919) 733-2655 for assistance during regular weekday office hours.
