With approach of hurricane season, Troxler advises farmers to review farm emergency plans and prepare

As the 2010 hurricane season opens, Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler reminds farmers to take necessary steps to help protect their farms, families and workers if a storm strikes.

"Planning now can help reduce the potential damage from hurricanes and tropical storms later," Troxler said. "I encourage all farmers to review their plans and get ready for what could be an active storm season."

Hurricane season runs June 1-Nov. 30, and weather researchers at N.C. State University have predicted 15 to 18 named storms forming in the Atlantic this year, with as many as 11 becoming hurricanes.

Farmers need to make preparations for their families, workers, equipment and buildings, and have backup plans for electricity and

drinkable water for their barns and other critical farm facilities, Troxler said. In addition, livestock operations should maintain emergency plans that address power needs and on-site feed capabilities.

Troxler said farmers should have a transfer switch properly installed so they can use a generator. A properly installed transfer switch is critical for the protection of farm facilities and utility workers, he said.

Troxler offered the following tips for preparing farms for major storms:

- Store or secure items or equipment that might blow away.

Farm to School program posts a record-setting year

With increased orders for North Carolina strawberries and blueberries, the N.C. Farm to School Program will end the year with a new record for school sales of North Carolina commodities.

In total, schools systems purchased \$800,000 worth of North Carolina commodities in 2009-2010, easily outpacing 2008-2009 sales by \$100,000.

School systems across the state ordered 13,315 flats of

strawberries, more than 600 flats above the 2009 totals. Orders for blueberries more than doubled, to a total of 1,738 flats this year.

"It is great to end the year not only with record sales of strawberries and blueberries, but also the yearly record sales for the Farm to School program. In the end, our students and our farmers are the big winners," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "Each year the program

grows as word spreads about the healthy and nutritious fruits and vegetables being offered. I look forward to topping \$1 million in sales in the near future."

Strawberries were scheduled for delivery to school systems through the week of May 24. Blueberry deliveries began May 24 and run through June 21. A total of 46 schools are featuring either red or blue berries on their lunch menus.

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Food Distribution and Marketing divisions coordinate the Farm to School Program. In addition to strawberries, school systems are able to purchase other commodities, including watermelons, cantaloupes, tomatoes, apples, cabbage, broccoli and sweet potatoes. Interest in farmers markets is stronger than ever, thanks in part to the momentum of the buy-local food movement. More and more people are interested in knowing where their food comes from and are looking to connect with farmers in their area, and farmers markets offer a central location for buyers and sellers.

This is welcome news to farmers and has led to more farmers markets sprouting up across the state to meet the demands of consumers.

North Carolina shoppers are fortunate because the state features a wide array of markets, from smaller one-day venues to larger regional markets that are open year-round. Some markets seem to specialize in organic foods, while others may offer a mix of conventionally produced foods and organic fare.

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services operates five regional markets in Asheville, Charlotte, Greensboro, Lumberton and Raleigh. But you can find

farmers markets from the mountains to the coast, which is handy if you are staying in the state for your vacation.

One of the easiest ways to locate a local market is by going to the department's N.C. Farm Fresh website at www.ncfarmfresh.com. Click on the find farmers markets link, which is searchable by county or by market name. We have more than 135 farmers markets listed, many with links to their

June is the time of year when market activity really starts to pick up. I enjoy visiting farmers markets to see what is in season and to see the variety of plants and food items for sale. I hope to get out and visit even more farmers markets this year as I travel the state.

The markets are also great places for family outings. They give parents an opportunity to talk to their children about where fruits and vegetables come from, and to let kids participate in selecting food for a meal.

Some markets host special events or short workshops, adding entertaining and educational

activities.

Plants also make up a big part of market offerings, especially in the spring and summertime when people are looking to shake off the effects of winter and get out in their yards.

At the State Farmers Market in Raleigh, for example, tents outside the main farmers building

are needed to house plant vendors. Despite having half of the building dedicated to plant sales, the Raleigh market has more plant vendors than available spaces.

One of the best tips I can offer to shoppers is to get to the market early, when you have your choice of fruits, vegetables and food

items. Many vendors harvest the same morning, so everything is super fresh.

If you have never visited a local farmers market, I encourage you to make this the year you do. I think you will be pleasantly surprised by all the things North Carolina farmers have to offer.

- Identify places to relocate animals from low-lying areas.
- Check generators to be sure they are in good working order and secure a sufficient amount of fuel to operate them.
- Turn off the propane supply at tanks.
- Secure propane tanks in the event of flooding to prevent them from floating away.
- Move equipment to the highest open ground possible away from trees or buildings that could cause damage.
- Mark animals with an identifier so they can be easily returned if lost. Examples are ear tags with name of farm and phone numbers, brands, paint markings on hooves or coat or clipped initials in the hair.
- Move feed to higher ground or to a more accessible place in case of flooding or transportation problems.
- Pesticide storage areas should be secure, and farmers in low-lying areas should do whatever they can to elevate or move pesticides to locations that are less likely to flood.
- Coordinate with neighbors beforehand and discuss what resources can be shared.

Examples include a backhoe or set of livestock panels.

- Keep a list of important phone numbers in order to make calls following a storm. Examples include the local emergency management office, county extension agent, insurance agent, county Farm Service Agency and private veterinarian.
- Monitor local weather reports for up-to-the-minute information on storms.

Three specialty foods companies take top honors in product awards contest

Companies from Jamesville, Rougemont and Elizabethtown were winners in the Product Awards Competition at the spring conference of the N.C. Specialty Foods Association.

Mackey's Ferry of Jamesville won in the Pastry/Cookies/Cakes category for its Molasses Cookies. Fancy's Candy's of Rougemont won in the Confections/Candy/Chocolate category for its Sin in a Tin Milk Chocolate and Walnut Toffee. D'vine Foods of Elizabethtown was the winner in the Beverage category for Muscadine Cider.

"We have a wonderful assortment of specialty foods companies here in North Carolina, and it's great that we can take an opportunity to recognize their excellence," said

Ag Commissioner Steve Troxler. "I'm proud of the work our N.C. food companies do and the great products they represent."

Twelve entries competed in the Pastry/Cookies/Cakes category, 10 competed in the Confections/Candy/Chocolate category, and eight competed in the Beverage category. Runners-up from each category, respectively, were Mediterranean Treats of Bakersville, Mackey's Ferry and D'vine Foods. Products were judged by a panel of industry experts: Norma Miller, culinary instructor at Wake Technical Community College; cookbook author Foy Edelman; and Andrea Weigl, food writer for The News & Observer of Raleigh.

The NCSFA is a statewide organization of more than

60 manufacturing and retail companies involved in the production and marketing of a variety of specialty foods products. Elaine Fryar, of Fryar's Sauce Co. in McLeansville, is president of the organization.

Tim Sperry of Wellesley, Mass., a nationally recognized specialty foods marketing specialist, was the keynote speaker at the conference.

Sperry began his career in specialty foods with Wellspring Grocery in Chapel Hill. He was instrumental in the merger of Wellspring into the Whole Foods chain and the expansion of Whole Foods across the country and into London. He currently heads his own marketing and organizational consulting practice for the specialty foods trade.

The Best Dish in NC competition is a statewide contest that recognizes and rewards the efforts of restaurants and chefs who use North Carolina products regularly in their menus. The finalists were chosen based on their proposed menus and marketing plans for promoting the menu. Chefs were allowed to enter a combination of dishes (for example, an appetizer with an entrée and dessert), but each was judged as a single entry.

Finalists are required to feature the dish or combination of courses in their restaurant for at least a four-week period in May, June or July. During this time, the judges will visit to sample the entries and judge each restaurant on its use of North Carolina products, creativity, presentation, taste and promotion. First-, second- and third-place winners will be announced in August.
