Special storm weather preparedness edition

Troxler advises farmers to have plans in place well before storms

As the state prepares to enter hurricane season, Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler reminds farmers to have emergency plans in place for their farms and share those plans with workers in advance of potential storms.

“As the April tornadoes across Eastern North Carolina showed us, severe weather can come in many forms and at any time,” Troxler said. “Having an emergency plan in place, along with a ready list of emergency contacts so you know who to call, can be critical to your operations immediately following severe weather.”

“Every farming operation is different and has different needs,” he said. “Assessing, in advance, what your most pressing needs will be if you should lose power, or are at risk for flooding, can be the difference between salvaging a crop or saving livestock.” Previous storm experiences

have shown that back-up generators are in high demand following storms and on-site feeding capabilities for livestock operations are also critical.

“The need for generators is always high when a storm strikes,” Troxler said. “We encourage farmers to contact local farm suppliers and rental companies in advance of storms to reserve a generator on their own in the event of power outages. There are no guarantees that state-owned generators will be available for farmers and livestock owners.”

Troxler reminded farmers that they should have a transfer switch properly installed ahead of time so they can use a generator. A properly installed transfer switch is critical for the protection of farm facilities and utility workers, he said.

Farmers are also encouraged to add the phone number of their county emergency management office to their list of important numbers. County emergency (See Emergency pg. 4)

More preparedness tips to consider

- Closely monitor local weather reports for up-to-the-minute information on storms.
- Store or secure items or equipment that might blow away.
- Relocate livestock and animals from low-lying areas.
- Check generators to be sure they are in good working order and secure a sufficient amount of fuel to operate them.
- Turn off the propane supply at tanks.
- Secure propane tanks in the event of flooding to prevent them from floating away.
- Move equipment to the highest open ground possible away from trees or buildings that could cause damage.
- Mark animals with an identifier so they can be easily returned if lost. Examples are ear tags with name of farm and phone numbers, brands, paint markings on hooves or coat or clipped initials in the hair.
- Move feed to higher ground or to a more accessible place in case of flooding or transportation problems.
- Coordinate with neighbors beforehand and discuss what resources can be shared. Examples include a backhoe or set of panels.
- Keep a list of important phone numbers. Examples include the local emergency management office, county extension agent, insurance agent, county Farm Service Agency and private veterinarian.
- Secure or move pesticides to higher ground in the event of flooding.

From the tractor

North Carolina is no stranger to natural disasters. From hurricanes and tornadoes to flooding and drought, we have experienced them all in varying degrees. Some events have been statewide and, thankfully, some have been more isolated, but all have the potential to be life-changing. We were reminded of this fact by the destructive tornadoes that rolled through the state in April.

Farmers are used to dealing with the weather as they work to bring a crop to harvest, but extreme weather presents challenges that are not routine.

That is one of the reasons we have dedicated this issue of the Agricultural Review to storm weather preparedness. You will find addresses and numbers for Farm Service Agency offices for each county. Some offices serve multiple counties, and it is important that you know who to report damage to in the event of severe weather. Information collected on the county level helps determine whether disaster declarations can be made.

Many farms have generators

on hand, but some do not. Locating a power source is one often one of the first orders of business for a farm. Loss of power can present problems for livestock and crop producers alike. Curing, drying and refrigeration can all be affected by the loss of power. Feed mills and cooling systems in livestock operations also suffer when the power is out. If you have a generator, check it regularly to make sure it will work properly when needed. If you do not

NCSU researchers predict above-normal hurricane activity in 2011

According to Dr. Lian Xie, professor of marine, earth and atmospheric sciences, and collaborators Dr. Montserrat Fuentes, professor of statistics, and graduate student Morgan Lennon, 2011 should see 13 to 16 named storms forming in the Atlantic basin, which includes the entire Atlantic Ocean, the Gulf of Mexico and the Caribbean Sea. This number is significantly higher than the (1955-2000) 50-year average of 9.6 named storms, but less than last year's total of 19.

Of those named storms, seven to nine may grow strong enough to become hurricanes, and there is a 70 percent chance that one of those storms will make landfall along the coast of the southeastern United States, and a 40 percent chance that the landfalling storm will arrive as a hurricane. There is a 15 percent chance that the storm will be classified as a major – category 3 or above – hurricane.

As for the Gulf, Xie's data indicate the likelihood of three to five named storms forming,

of which one to three will become hurricanes. The researchers expect two to four of the named storms to make landfall along the Gulf, and there is a 72 percent chance that at least one of those storms will be of hurricane status. In addition, there is a 45 percent chance that one major hurricane will hit the U.S. Gulf Coast.

Xie's methodology evaluates data from the last 100 years on Atlantic Ocean hurricane positions and intensity, as well as other variables including weather patterns and sea surface temperatures, in order to predict how many storms will form and where they will make landfall.

The Atlantic hurricane season runs from June 1 through Nov. 30.

Food safety – What to do if the power goes out

Whenever the power is out, people wonder what to do about their refrigerators and freezers. Here are some tips from the N.C. Cooperative Extension for keeping things cold as long as possible.

- If your freezer is only half full, freeze containers of clean drinking water. A full freezer can stay cold for several days, even in the summer.
- Check with a local locker plant to see if it can take frozen foods in an emergency.
- Check for local sources of dry ice.
- If you think the power may go out, turn the freezer temperature to the coldest possible setting.
- If you do lose power, do not open the freezer door. You can insulate the freezer with blankets or quilts. Be careful not to block the vent.

Foods that require no cooking

Breakfast items:

- Fruit or canned juice
- Ready-to-eat cereals or breakfast bars
- Breads or crackers with jams, jellies, margarine, peanut butter, cheese or cheese spreads
- Milk (canned, evaporated or reconstituted powdered milk)
- Instant coffee, tea or cocoa

Lunch or supper items:

- Processed cheese or cheese

spreads

- Canned vegetables
- Peanut butter
- Canned meats, fish, poultry
- Canned beans
- Raw vegetables
- Fruits
- Bread, crackers, cookies
- Canned puddings

Snacks:

- Nuts and seeds, fruit leathers, beef jerky, hard candy, granola

Pet care tips

Traveling with a pet

- Be sure your pet's vaccinations are up to date.
- Be sure your cat or dog wears a properly fitted collar with a current ID and rabies tag at all times.
- Take a leash with you when you travel.

If a pet must stay behind

- Bring pet indoors well ahead of a storm.
- Do not leave it tied up outside or tied up during a hurricane.
- Leave only dry-type food to discourage overeating.
- Don't leave a cat and dog together, even if they are normally friendly.
- Leave water in bath tub or other sturdy containers that will not spill.
- Provide access to high places, such as countertops, in case flooding occurs.

management offices will be coordinating emergency crop and livestock assistance, including requests for generators.

In addition, pesticide applicators should look to secure their pesticide storage areas. Applicators in low-lying areas should do whatever they can to elevate or move pesticides to locations that are less likely to flood.
