Quarantine area for imported fire ant expands

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is expanding a state quarantine for the imported fire ant in a continuing effort to monitor and address this pest. With the expansion, the quarantine now includes portions or entire areas of 70 counties.

The quarantine expansion means residents and business owners in all of Currituck, Durham and Hertford counties, and portions of Alamance, Granville, Guilford, Iredell, Rutherford and Vance counties will now need to obtain a permit before moving plants, sod and related equipment into or through non-infested areas. Effective immediately, the imported fire ant quarantine is revised to include the addition of:

- Currituck County - The entire county.
- Durham County - The entire county.
- Hertford County - The entire county.
- Alamance County - The area south of Interstate 85 from the Guilford County line to the Orange County line.
- Granville County - The area south of U.S. 158 from the Person County line to the Vance County line.
- Guilford County - The area south of I-40 from the Alamance County line to the Forsyth County line.
- Iredell County - The area south of I-40 from the Davie County line to the Catawba County line.
- Rutherford County - The

area south and east of N.C. 108 from the Polk County line to the junction of U.S. 64 E. to the McDowell County line.

- Vance County - The area south of I-85 from the Warren County line to the Granville County line.

Items requiring a permit include sod, soil, hay and straw, nursery plant material, logs or pulpwood with soil, and soil-moving equipment. Movement of infested materials could result in the establishment and secondary spread of the pest to non-infested areas.

Businesses and individuals within the quarantined areas will need to obtain a permit to move these materials through or to non-quarantined areas. Certificates can be obtained from a local

plant protection specialist or by contacting the Plant Protection Section at (800) 206-9333 or (919) 733-6932.

"Failure to obtain the needed inspections and certifications may result in the issuance of a stop-sale notice and rejection or destruction of the regulated article," said Gene Cross, director of the NCDA&CS Plant Industry Division. "Fire ants can be harmful to humans and livestock. It is critical we continue proactive efforts to slow down fire ant movement into non-infested areas of the state."

Antique tractors wanted for 2010 Got to Be NC Festival

The Got to Be NC Festival, presented by the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, will feature a carnival, live music, food and wine expo, tractor pulls, draft horse pulls, classic cars, Harley-Davidson motorcycles, lawnmower racing and a barbecue cook-off.

Festival hours are 9 a.m. to midnight May 21 and 22, and 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. May 23. Admission and parking for the festival are free. There (See Tractors, pg. 2)

history of working with N.C. State to advance the profession of agriculture, and this series is an exciting new extension of this partnership.


This lecture series is designed for students in the College of Agriculture and Life Science and will feature a number of guest speakers coming in to talk about their particular area of knowledge in agriculture. I moderate the discussions, giving students an opportunity to ask questions and learn from some of the successful leaders and pioneers in the industry.

The first lecture was "International Agriculture Marketing: Lessons from North Carolina's Experts." The March 11 lecture will be on

"The Realities and Rewards of Farming as a Career Choice" and the April 14 series finale will be on "Innovation in Agriculture: What's the Next 'Big Thing?'"

One of my main goals is to give students information and inspiration about agriculture, and I am looking forward to the next lectures.

Also in February, I was able to attend the 54th National Outstanding Young Farmers Award banquet hosted by the national Jaycees organization. This annual event recognizes a young farmer for his or her commitment and dedication to excellence in agriculture. Farmers are nominated at the state level, and compete against other state nominees for the national award.



Several years back, I was the national award winner and it was quite an honor -- one that I am still humbled by and extremely proud of.

Value-added agricultural operations are an emerging sector of North Carolina agriculture. A series of three informational sessions (two meetings and a webinar) will be held across North Carolina in March to explain and answer questions about several funding programs in place to assist value-added producers.

The series will cover the USDA Value-Added Producer Grant and the new N.C. Value-Added Cost Share Program, administered by N.C. MarketReady.
