Cotton, sweet potato and wheat acreage will be up

North Carolina farmers say they will plant more acres of cotton, sweet potatoes and wheat this year compared with 2010, according to a recent U.S. Department of Agriculture's Prospective Plantings report.

Farmers intend to plant less corn, soybeans and peanuts, the report said. Cotton growers intend to plant 750,000 acres this year, 36 percent higher than last year's acreage and the most since 2006.

"With cotton prices hovering around \$2 a pound, it's not surprising to see farmers planning to grow more of it this year," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler.

Wheat already is in the ground, and its 700,000 acres represent a 40 percent increase over last year's total and matches the 2009 amount. The dip in wheat acreage in 2010 was the result of poor field conditions in the fall of 2009,

Troxler said. "It was too wet to plant. But this past fall, conditions were good and wheat prices are still strong," he said.

Farmers intend to plant 60,000 acres of sweet potatoes, up 5,000 from last year. North Carolina leads the nation in sweet potato production, and acreage has increased each year since 2005. Troxler attributes the growth to higher demand for sweet potatoes, both domestically and internationally. Acreage of flue-cured tobacco is forecast to increase modestly this year, to 168,000 acres. Burley acres will remain unchanged at 2,300.

With cotton acreage growing, something had to give, which explains the 6 percent decrease in soybean acreage and 7 percent drop in peanut acreage, Troxler said. Corn acreage

NCDA&CS offers specialty crop grants

Deadline for applications is May 20

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is offering grants to fund new projects to enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops in the marketplace.

The Specialty Crop Block Grant Program is managed by NCDA&CS and funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture under the 2008 farm bill. Last year NCDA&CS awarded more than \$1 million to 22 projects that benefited North Carolina's specialty crops industry and helped local farmers grow more profitable

crops.

NCDA&CS will accept grant applications starting at \$10,000 from non-profit organizations and corporations, commodity associations, state and local government agencies, colleges and universities. Applicants must reside in North Carolina, or their business or educational affiliation must be within the state. Application deadline is 5 p.m. May 20.

From the tractor by Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler

Mother Nature is one of the most unpredictable forces, maybe even the most unpredictable. And when her powerful energy takes shape as a hurricane or tornado, the results are often catastrophic and deadly, as we witnessed in mid-April when tornados rolled across the state randomly tearing apart homes, uprooting businesses and leaving holes in families.

My sympathies go out to those families who lost loved ones in the tornados. Homes, businesses, structures, equipment and things can all be replaced, but for those who lost family and friends, their losses are

permanent.


Shortly after the storms, I toured areas of the state looking at agricultural damage and talking to farmers about their immediate and long-term needs. Without doubt, there are lots of needs. For many of the farms hit, the tornados were life-changing events. A lifetime of work was lost in just minutes under the brutal assault of these storms.

Many times in North Carolina when we talk about agricultural storm damage, we are talking about the loss of crops and livestock. These storms were different because they happened so early in the season. This is planting time, so many crops

were just planted or would soon be going in the ground. A few crops did sustain some hail damage and there were also some livestock losses, but not as widespread as we have seen in the past with some late-season hurricanes.

Instead, growers lost curing barns, greenhouses equipment, storage buildings, poultry houses and homes.

I saw bulk barns in Lee County that were tossed around like matchboxes and I saw steel beams set in 2 or more feet of concrete that were ripped from the ground like new seedlings. I also saw large greenhouses flattened, cotton pickers tossed around like toy cars and debris strewn across acre after acre

of farmland.

The difficult part for these farmers is that they need their equipment now to get seeds and plants in the field. And down the road they will need to replace sprayers, curing barns and

could drop by 2 percent. "We basically ran out of acres for soybeans, peanuts and corn," he said. "There are only so many acres out there that can go into producing field crops, so you've got to have a tradeoff.

"I think we're going to max out our available acreage this year," Troxler said. "Farmers might break out whatever ground they think they can do something with."

Troxler pointed out that weather, input costs and changes in commodity prices

still could affect the acreage planted. "We'll know more June 30, when the next USDA acreage report comes out," he said.

Dairy farmers will vote May 24 on whether to continue to allocate a portion of the mandatory national dairy check-off fee collected for North Carolina dairy promotions. Currently, 10 cents of the 15 cents collected per hundredweight of milk is designated to dairy promotions in North Carolina. The remaining 5 cents goes to National Dairy Promotion and Research Board. N.C. dairy producers must vote every six years to renew the 10-cent local promotion option through the N.C. Dairy Referendum. Every dairy farm in the state has a vote, and to pass the referendum, two-thirds of those voting must approve the measure. Dairymen should contact their local N.C. Cooperative Extension Service to find their voting location.

local food efforts," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "Nearly \$1.2 million is available this year from USDA to support the North Carolina specialty crop industry."

Projects involving the following specialty crops are eligible: fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture, Christmas trees, turfgrass/sod, and nursery and greenhouse crops. Funding is also available for projects aimed at developing local

and regional food systems and improving food access.

Grants are not available for projects that directly benefit or provide a profit to a single organization, institution or individual.
