Five North Carolinians have been appointed to serve on U.S. Department of Agriculture Advisory Committees. The following are appointees:

Larry Wooten, of the N.C. Farm Bureau, will serve on the Agricultural Policy Advisory Committee; Donald Butler, of Murphy-Brown LLC, will serve on the Agricultural Technical Advisory Committee (ATAC) for Trade in Animals and Animal Products; Peter Thornton, of the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, will serve on the ATAC for Trade in Processed Foods; and James Quinn, of Carolinas Cotton Growers Cooperative Inc., and Clyde Wayne Jr., of Tobacco Associates, Inc., both will serve on the ATAC for Trade in Tobacco, Cotton and Peanuts.

Congress established the advisory committee system in 1974 to ensure a private-sector voice in establishing U.S. agricultural trade policy objectives.

Whether it's the exhibits, entertainment or competitions, visitors will find a lot to love about the 2011 N.C. State Fair, to be held Oct. 13-23 at the N.C. State Fairgrounds.

The latest exhibit to join the State Fair Ark, Field of Dreams and other fair favorites is Cultivate a Career. The exhibit, located near Gate 12, allows visitors to go on an interactive, career-personality scavenger hunt to learn about a wide variety of jobs available in the agriculture industry.

Fairgoers can "drive" a high-tech tractor in a simulation game, analyze

college and career advice. Cultivate a Career is in the previous location of the Green N.C. exhibit.

"I think a lot of fairgoers will be surprised by the variety of careers available in the agriculture industry," Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler said. "Cultivate a Career is a great way of highlighting ag-related jobs which employ nearly a fifth of the state's workforce."

In addition to the new exhibit, two entertainers also will be making their N.C. State Fair debuts this year. The Amazing Arthur Fratelli, Professional Show-off and Comedy Superhero, is a one-of-a-kind show featuring juggling, yo-yo tricks,

Farmers urged to have corn tested for aflatoxin

Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler encourages farmers to have their corn tested for aflatoxin to prevent contamination of feeds and food.

Aflatoxin is a byproduct of the mold *Aspergillus flavus*, and can be harmful to both humans and livestock.

"The hot summer and the heavy rains from Hurricane

Irene have increased the potential for aflatoxin in corn," Troxler said. "It's very important that farmers have their corn tested."

Some farmers may need to have corn samples tested for crop insurance or quality assurance purposes. These samples must be submitted to a grain marketing location certified by the U.S.

Department of Agriculture. The tests cost \$22.20 per sample.

For insurance or quality assurance purposes, farmers must submit a 5-pound sample of shelled corn by mail, UPS or FedEx to a USDA-certified grain marketing location.

From the tractor

The September issue of the Ag Review was already at the printer when Hurricane Irene struck North Carolina on Aug. 27, so this is my first opportunity to comment on the agricultural damage the storm caused.

Certainly the agricultural community saw a great deal of damage from this storm. Shortly after the storm

cleared the state, I flew over Eastern North Carolina with House Speaker Thom Tillis and Senate President Pro Tem Phil Berger surveying the damage.

A few days later I joined Gov. Bev Perdue, U.S. Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack and Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano on another aerial tour of the area. While we saw some infrastructure and equipment damage, it was crops that took a real beating.

Irene's path pretty much covered the largest crop production centers of the state. For example, 76 percent of the corn crop is grown east of Interstate 95; 73 percent of tobacco and 75 percent of all soybeans produced in the state are also grown in this area.

Early estimates put crop losses in the hundreds of millions of dollars. Yields for most major crops are expected to be down significantly from earlier predictions. Based on the latest USDA crop reports, the projected yield for flue-cured tobacco is expected to be down by 500 pounds per acre. The cotton yield is expected to drop by 106 pounds per acre and the corn yield, already forecast to be bad because of drought, is expected to be about 78 bushels an acre. That's a drop of nearly 30 bushels per acre below the 10-year average.

Crop losses, like farm profits, have a trickle-down effect in the community, and don't just stop with the producer. Many growers have employees to pay, equipment to pay for, supplies to buy,

etc. And that is just the business-related expenses. You also have home and vehicle expenses, food purchases and more.

The aftermath of this storm will be felt for some time in these communities. Apart from the Farm Service Agency loans, it remains unclear what other kinds of government assistance may be available.

I called an emergency meeting of the Board of Agriculture following the tours. I wanted to hear from board members about concerns they were hearing from farmers in their areas, and I also wanted to talk about things we can do to help farmers recover from disasters now and in the future.

comedy and magic. Fratelli will perform daily outside the Expo Building. Also, fairgoers will want to be on the lookout for DiVine, the "living vine," who will be roaming the grounds around the Flower Show and Heritage Circle daily.

During Senior Citizens Day Tuesday, Oct. 18, those ages 65 and older can enjoy a free Bojangles breakfast and entertainment at the Senior Citizens Fun Festival. The event will take place in Dorton Arena from 9 to 11 a.m. and include a performance of '50s "doo-wop" music by Frankie Faucet and the Drips.

Seniors also can enjoy

some friendly competition during a Nintendo Wii Bowling tournament at the IGX tent near Gate 10. The seniors-only contest will be held at 11:30 a.m. and gift cards will be awarded to the first-place and second-place winners.

Dairy lovers will be excited about the cheese and butter contests added to State Fair competitions this year. The new contest is limited to licensed cheese and butter makers in the state, and looks to find the best locally produced dairy products.

Awards will be presented on Oct. 11 during the Got to Be NC Cheese and Butter Reception and Auction.

In addition, visitors will notice physical improvements to the fairgrounds as well. Sidewalk improvements, started this summer, will offer pedestrians safer walking paths on Hillsborough Street and give train riders an easier experience getting to the gate.

The familiar fencing at Gate 1 will be replaced by a larger tent structure as the fairgrounds prepares for an expanded entranceway to be completed in 2012. Inside Gate 1, fairgoers will find a new station for wheelchairs and strollers and more ATM locations available on the south side of the

fairgrounds.

Visitors also will notice the new Kerr Drug General Store near the Waterfall. Fairgoers can stop by the general store for anything they need, from antacids and aspirin to memory cards and batteries.

This year, the State Fair will offer a special military discount each day of the fair. Military personnel, including active duty, reserve, National Guard, retired and veterans are invited to take advantage of a discounted admission price of \$5. This discount is not available in advance or online. To obtain the discount, military personnel must show a military or veteran identification at the

gate.

Discount tickets are available online now through Oct. 13. Adult tickets are \$6 in advance, \$8 at the gate. Children's tickets are \$2 in advance or \$3 at the gate. Children 5 and under and seniors age 65 and older get in free. Ride sheets also can be purchased in advance for \$10 for a sheet of 18 tickets.

After discussions with the Board of Agriculture, I was asked to provide an update to two legislative committees.

Like me, members of this committee recognize that every time we have an agricultural disaster, we find ourselves in the same situation. Farmers have little help from the federal government. Low-interest loans don't provide adequate help, and the standing disaster relief program, known as SURE, is too slow.

We need to look more closely at policies and programs that may be able to provide help in the event of an agricultural disaster if some changes were made or additional language was added.

Here are a few ideas I presented to legislators: -- Create a bridge loan program to be administered through the Agricultural Finance Authority. Under

this program, the AFA would guarantee up to 20 percent of a loan amount for farmers in declared disaster counties who are in need of an immediate boost to their cash flow. Private lenders would make a decision regarding whether to make short-term loans, but the AFA would guarantee 20 percent of the amount. I do not anticipate that the 20 percent amounts would need to be spent, but rather it would just be money to set aside. I suggested \$25 million would be a conservative amount to start this program.

-- Create agricultural disaster strike teams by leveraging resources within our department such as the N.C. Forest Service, Emergency Programs, Research Stations and our regional agronomists.

-- Allow the Board of Agriculture to recommend a state agricultural emergency declaration and that would then grant the Commissioner of Agriculture the ability to declare a state of agricultural emergency. With that declaration, the Commissioner would have the flexibility to temporarily suspend certain rules, which would allow farmers to more quickly and efficiently harvest crops immediately before and after a weather

event and clean up debris. -- Another recommendation was to further develop the N.C. Forest Service's Young Offenders Program. The Forest Service and the Department of Correction already cooperate on a program in Western North Carolina, but there is no counterpart in the Eastern. Under the program, assistance could be provided on public and private property in partnership with the strike teams I mentioned earlier. -- Finally, I suggested we create a state emergency

assistance fund for agriculture, to be modeled after other states, such as Missouri and Louisiana. I hope we can gain traction with some of these ideas. We cannot afford to lose farms and farmers and their economic contributions to this state. As I mentioned before, farm dollars trickle down in the economy, particularly in more rural communities. It is in all of our best interests to maintain a healthy agricultural economy.
