On the Horizon

The N.C. State Fair will be here before you know it. The annual fall event runs Oct. 14-24 in Raleigh.

Fairgoers still have time to purchase their advance tickets online at www.ncstatefair.org to save money on admission and rides. The Fair is also offering an online only Early Bird Special through Sept. 29.

With the Early Bird Special, ticket buyers can earn up to three free adult admission tickets based on the total purchase amount before convenience fees. Spending between \$40 and \$100 earns one free ticket. Purchases of \$100.01 to \$200 will earn fairgoers two free tickets, and purchases of more than \$200 earn three free tickets.

Admission, ride, grandstand and Dorton Arena concert tickets apply toward the purchase total. Purchases cannot be combined.

Advance tickets are \$6 for adults and \$2 for children, compared to \$8 for adults and \$3 for kids at the gate. An 18-ticket ride sheet will cost \$10 in advance, saving fairgoers \$8 off the price of ride tickets at the Fair. Children under age 6 and adults 65 and over get in free.

17th Annual Mountain State Fair runs Sept. 10-19

The N.C. Mountain State Fair is a western North Carolina tradition marking its 17th year of family-friendly entertainment.

The food, fun and mountain heritage returns to the Western N.C. Ag Center in Fletcher Sept. 10-19.

The Virginia C. Boone Mountain Heritage Center and the Livestock Exhibition Building will house the finest crafts, handmade goods, artwork and horticulture products that western N.C. has to offer.

In addition, residents from across the region will arrive with their best livestock in tow in hopes of winning a coveted blue ribbon in one of the numerous livestock competitions.

Fairgoers will find plenty of thrilling rides from the mild to the wild, with the return of fan favorites like the Enterprise, the Seattle wheel and the chairlift,

which stretches from one end of the midway to the other and provides a bird's eye view.

New to the fair this year will be live music on the Bojangles

Music Stage, which will host 30 local and regional bands daily. The stage will be outdoors and centrally located on the fairgrounds. All performances will be free for fairgoers with paid admission.

McGough Arena will host country music star Chuck Wicks on Wednesday, Sept. 15, and Christian musical groups The Oxendines and This Hope on Thursday, Sept. 16.

Tickets for each show are specially priced at \$15 for adults and \$8 for children and seniors, and will include admission to the fair.

The Heritage Stage will continue to host Mountain Music and Bluegrass each night as the Mountain Music (See Mountain Fair, pg. 2)

Commissioner Troxler elected SASDA president

Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler recently was elected president of the Southern Association of State Departments of Agriculture. He will serve a one-year term.

SASDA's membership is composed of the agriculture departments of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, U.S. Virgin Islands, Virginia and West Virginia. The organization is a regional arm of the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture.

As president, Troxler will work to build consensus among member states on agricultural policy issues and communicate SASDA's policy recommendations to NASDA. He also serves on the board of NASDA and chairs that organization's Tobacco Task Force and Food Regulation and Nutrition Committee.

North Carolina will be the host state for SASDA's annual meeting in June 2011.

NCDA&CS warns horse owners about disease

North Carolina has joined a growing list of states with cases of equine piroplasmiasis, an animal disease the U.S. was free of for 20 years, Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler recently announced.

Tests of blood samples submitted to the National Veterinary Services Laboratory in Ames, Iowa, confirmed the presence of EP in 11 horses in four locations. North Carolina joins 19 other states that have identified cases of the disease in the past two years.

State veterinary authorities

immediately quarantined the premises where the horses resided. The quarantine means that no horses can be moved from these locations.

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is conducting an investigation to determine the source of the disease and whether it has spread beyond the locations where the infected animals were housed.

As many of our readers know, we have been actively involved in efforts to promote and raise awareness of North Carolina products in grocery stores, in restaurants and at farmers markets through the Got to Be NC campaign.

This started as a grass-roots campaign five years ago and has now grown into a nationally recognized marketing campaign thanks to the continued support of the N.C. General Assembly.

In addition, thanks to grants from the GoldenLEAF Foundation and the N.C. Tobacco Trust Fund Commission, we have updated and expanded the NCFarmFresh.com website, which helps consumers easily find local farms or local products

in their area.

The timing of these efforts could not have been any better because we have been working to raise awareness at the same time consumer interest in locally grown food has been on a fast rise. I see it is kind of like adding lighter fluid to the grill. Things heat up much more quickly.

Selling commodities direct to consumers is a win for growers, for consumers and for North Carolina's economy. Growers can capture a retail price for their fruit, vegetables, cheeses and meats compared to a wholesale price, and consumers get a product that often has been harvested that day. And the economy gets a boost from the success of these small businesses.

The Center for Environmental Farming Systems has recently launched a consumer campaign that marries well with our Got to Be NC efforts. The "10% Campaign," is designed to encourage North Carolina consumers to spend 10 percent of their food dollars to support local food producers, related businesses and communities.

I think this is a great idea and I hope consumers embrace it. Setting a goal encourages people to be more aware of their food buying habits and how we can each make a difference in our community by supporting local businesses.

According to information from CEFS, North Carolinians spend about \$35 billion annually on

food. So directing just 10 percent of our food spending to buying local products, would add up to about \$3.5 billion. That would be a significant investment in our local economy, not to mention the added trickle-down effect those dollars would (See 10% Campaign, pg. 2)

Rowland man named N.C. Swisher Sweets/Sunbelt Expo Southeastern Farmer of the Year

Michael "Bo" Thompson Stone of Rowland has opened his farm to school children while building a thriving diversified row crop and livestock operation.

As a result of his success as a farmer, Stone has been selected as the 2010 North Carolina winner of the Swisher Sweets/Sunbelt Expo Southeastern Farmer of the Year award.

Stone now joins nine other state winners from the Southeast as finalists for the award. The overall winner will be announced on Tuesday, Oct. 19, at the Sunbelt Ag Expo farm show in Moultrie, Ga.

A farmer for 14 years, he operates 1,110 acres of rented land and 1,108 acres of owned land. Major crops last year included corn on 800 acres yielding 135 bushels per acre, wheat on 800 acres yielding 65 bushels per acre, soybeans on 1,000 acres yielding 37 bushels per acre and strawberries on 2 acres yielding 17,000 pounds per acre. In addition, he feeds out hogs as a contract grower, producing about 10,000 head per year from six houses. He also has a beef herd of 70 cows.

Strawberries have been especially profitable. He picks most of the strawberries for sale from a roadside stand and for local deliveries. You-pick customers gather the rest.

Stone also has some 350 acres in timber. A state forester helped him develop a management plan. He thinned timber two years ago and uses prescribed burning to reduce competition and improve wildlife habitat.

He grows swine for Murphy-Brown LLC. "We furnish the buildings and labor, and they furnish the feed and hogs," he said. "We're paid on per pound of gain and feed efficiency." His commercial beef herd produces calves within a two-month period. He raises the calves for seven to 11 months, depending on market prices.

All crops except his strawberries are planted with no tillage. This allows him to tend 2,000 acres with two tractors.

"Some fields haven't seen a disk since I came back to the farm," he said. "I don't know if my best land is getting better, but I definitely see improvement in my marginal land." He plants corn and soybeans in 20-inch rows, and grows soybeans and wheat as seed crops for Pioneer.

In 2006, he put in his first 5-acre corn maze and has hosted 15,000 school children since then. "The maze is fun, but a lot of work," he said. He charges \$7 per person. The children get to play in the maze and learn how food is grown. He also treats children to hayrides and gives them pumpkins to carve.

As an 8-year-old, his first farm job was picking up tobacco leaves from a custom-made harvester seat. "I've been involved in farming ever since," Stone said.

After earning two degrees from North Carolina State University, he worked for the Gold Kist cooperative just long enough to develop a yearning to return to the farm.

When he began farming in 1996, he developed a mission statement: to produce high quality food and farm products in

a profitable and environmentally responsible manner.

He bought his first farm in 1997 and a second one in 1998, the year he got married and faced a severe drought. "I represent the sixth generation of my family on this farm," Stone said.

One of his goals was to eliminate borrowed operating capital. "I borrowed operating money only once during the past 11 years, and that was to cover a cash flow problem after purchasing assets," he said. "I met this goal while doubling the size of my operation."

He uses global positioning and takes soil samples by soil type. He applies pesticides and fertilizer with a guidance system, and last year he adopted variable rate application.

Stone recently bought equipment to pump sludge from hog lagoons and spread it as fertilizer. He used this equipment at one of his own lagoons and believes custom pumping and spreading could become a profitable sideline.

He added subsurface drip irrigation on 15 acres where he planted watermelons and sweet

corn. He injects fertilizer through his drip lines to save on overall fertilizer use. He installed his first center pivot irrigation system last year, and will add more pivots in the years ahead.

Stone has 120,000 bushels of grain storage capacity on his farm, which influences his marketing.

"Marketing is the most important farm job I have," he said. He checks prices daily and says his crop budgets and accurate yield predictions allow him to profitably use forward pricing.

He's also taking part in the Conservation Security Program that rewards farmers for existing conservation practices.

Early on, tobacco was his major crop. "But I saw the industry changes coming and I sold my tobacco equipment after the 2008 season," Stone said. "I grew low-cost tobacco, but tobacco is labor-intensive, and I wanted to spend more time with my family. Also, the Conservation Security Program and my successful strawberry and corn maze enterprises convinced me I could transition out of tobacco without suffering significant financial losses."

He has been active in several organizations, including county Farm Bureau, First Baptist Church and the boards of Southeastern Regional Medical Center and two private schools.

On the state level, he has also been active in Farm Bureau. He served as president and in other positions with the N.C. Small Grain Growers Association. He's on Cape Fear Farm Credit's board and served on the Farm Service Agency state committee. In 2005, he won American Farm Bureau's Discussion Meet, and in 2006 he was runner-up in American Farm Bureau's Outstanding Young Farmer and Rancher Achievement Award program.

He has strong family support. His father Tommy Stone helps with the hogs and his grandfather Lyndell Stone often shows up to lend encouragement. Bo was especially pleased when he and his dad were able to buy farmland that once belonged to his great-great-grandfather.

Bo and his wife, Melissa

"Missy" Stone, have three children, Sarah Grace, 8; Olivia Ann, 7; and Thompson Lyn, 3.

"My parents gave me my opportunity to farm," Stone said. "Missy and my kids give me reasons to keep farming."

As the North Carolina state winner of the Swisher Sweets/Sunbelt Expo award, Stone will receive a \$2,500 cash award and an expense paid trip to the Sunbelt Expo from Swisher International of Jacksonville, Fla., a jacket and a \$200 gift certificate from the Williamson-Dickie Co., and a \$500 gift certificate from Southern States.

He is also now eligible for the \$15,000 that will go to the overall winner. Other prizes for the overall winner include the use of a Massey Ferguson tractor for a year from Massey Ferguson North America, a custom-made Canvasback gun safe from Misty Morn Safe Co., and another \$500 gift certificate from the Southern States cooperative.

Also, Williamson-Dickie will provide another jacket, a \$500 gift certificate and \$500 in cash to the overall winner.

Swisher International and the Sunbelt Expo are sponsoring the Southeastern Farmer of the Year Award for the 21st consecutive year. Swisher has contributed some \$804,000 in cash awards and other honors to Southeastern farmers since the award was initiated in 1990.

North Carolina has had two overall Southeastern Farmer of the Year winners: Eddie Johnson of Elkin in 2004 and Bill Cameron in 2007.

Stone's farm, along with the farms of the other nine state finalists, will be visited by a panel of judges. The judges for this year include James Lee Adams, a farmer from Camilla, Ga., and the overall winner of the award in 2000; Jim Bone, manager of field development for DuPont Crop Protection from Valdosta, Ga.; and Charles Snipes, a retired Mississippi Extension weed scientist who is president and research scientist with Stoneville R&D Inc., from Greenville, Miss.

Carolina should monitor their horses carefully and contact their veterinarian if they suspect this disease," Troxler said. "Because the U.S. has been free of this disease for two decades, by law suspected cases must be reported to the State Veterinarian's Office."

With the exception of the quarantined premises, there are no EP-related movement restrictions on horses within North Carolina or between North Carolina and other states.

State Veterinarian David

Marshall has implemented regulations under which horses from states known to contain EP-infected horses could be imported to North Carolina. The regulations are designed to minimize the possibility of more infected horses entering the state.

ABOUT EQUINE PIROPLASMOSIS

Equine piroplasmosis is a blood-borne parasitic disease primarily transmitted to horses by ticks or contaminated needles. The disease was eradicated from the United States in 1988. North

Carolina is not considered to have the tick species believed to transmit EP.

This disease is not directly contagious from one horse to another but requires direct blood transfer. Human infection with equine piroplasmosis is very rare.

Horses with acute cases of EP can have depression, fever, anemia, jaundiced mucous membranes and low platelet counts. EP can also cause horses to have roughened hair coats, constipation and colic. In its milder form, the disease causes

horses to appear weak and show lack of appetite. Some horses become chronic carriers of EP and show no clinical signs.

WHAT HORSE OWNERS SHOULD DO

Monitor your horse for the presence of ticks. Use commercially available topical products labeled for ticks if your horse is in an area where tick infestation is a problem. Most of these products are synthetic pyrethrins. Include an avermectin product in your de-worming program to provide systemic

treatment for ticks. Ask your veterinarian if you are unsure.

If you find large numbers of ticks or suspect piroplasmosis, please contact your veterinarian.

Do not share needles between animals in the administration of any medication or vaccinations. EP and other diseases can be spread by the introduction of blood cells from an infected animal into an uninfected animal during routine administration of medications by injection.

Continue your normal equine activities.
