Grant scams fail to deliver promised cash

One of the hottest scams this summer tries to trick people into paying for help winning government grants that don't even exist.

Grant scams use people's hopes for money to start a business, go back to school or fix up their home to bilk them out of hundreds or even thousands of dollars.

So far this year my office has heard from people who've lost a combined total of \$25,000 to grant scams. None of them ever got one dime of grant money.

Here's how the scammers usually operate: the company tells you that money is available through government grants for people just

like you—and that they can help you learn how to get it.

All you have to do is pay the company a fee. Or they tell you that you've already won a grant, and then ask you to hand over money or your bank account information before you can receive grant funds. In other cases, they may invite you to a seminar where they claim you'll learn how to win grants.

The latest grant scam targets farmers, offering them a five-year, \$15,000 business plan that includes a grant-writing service. Two farmers in Burgaw were promised loans and grants of \$371,000 by Valley Business Development.

EEE makes its return; owners urged to talk to vet

A 4-year-old horse in Halifax County was recently euthanized after contracting Eastern Equine Encephalomyelitis, a mosquito-borne disease that is preventable in equine by yearly vaccination. It is the first reported case of EEE in horses this year.

"The number of reported

EEE cases fluctuates each year," said State Veterinarian David Marshall. "Late summer to early fall is peak mosquito season in North Carolina, and this is right on schedule for us to start seeing cases."

North Carolina had 6 reported EEE cases in 2010, 23 in 2009 and 13 in 2008.

It is estimated that for every reported case, four or more cases go unreported. There was one case last year of West Nile virus, another mosquito-borne disease that affects equine.

The EEE and WNV vaccinations initially require two shots, 30 days apart, for horses, mules and

donkeys that have no prior vaccination history. Neither vaccination fully protects the animal until several weeks after the second shot, so it is best to vaccinate as early in the mosquito season as possible. Marshall recommends that horse

From the tractor

This past legislative session, the General Assembly passed what I think is one of the most important bills for agriculture in recent memory.

The bill accomplishes three things: First, it gives specific examples of items

or documents that can serve as evidence that property is being used for bona fide farm purposes. Any of the following items will count:

- farm sales tax exemption certificate;
- a copy of the property tax listing that shows the farm is eligible for the present use value program;
- a copy of Schedule F from the farm owner's income tax return;
- a forest management plan;
- a farm identification number issued by the Farm Service Agency.

The second thing the bill does is prohibit cities and towns from annexing legally identified farms without the consent of the owner.

Third, the bill states that legitimate farms in a city or town's extraterritorial jurisdiction are exempt from zoning requirements and ordinances.

These changes in legislation are important for North Carolina farmers. As cities across the state have grown, so has their extraterritorial jurisdiction, or ETJ. ETJ is the legal ability for a local government to exercise authority beyond its normal boundaries.

There have been numerous instances where a farmer out in a county had a farm building in need of extensive repair. But when the farmer went to do the work, he found out that his farm had become

part of an ETJ and was subject to local zoning and regulations. That meant a farmer had to get a building permit and deal with more regulations than he previously had to meet.

I have heard from many farmers on this issue because it was significant and costly to their farms.

I believe — and the legislature agreed — that if you have a farming operation, you should be entitled to the same exemptions in the ETJ that you were entitled to prior to becoming part of the ETJ.

I appreciate the support of the legislature in passing this legislation, which took effect in late June.

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NCD&CS offers industry workshops on complying with meat and poultry regulations

Small meat and poultry processors can learn more about complying with state and federal regulations at a workshop offered by the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services this fall.

The multi-day workshop will take place in October. There is no fee for the course, which is being sponsored by the department's Meat and Poultry Inspection Division.

"This course is designed specifically to assist small and very small processors in meeting regulatory requirements," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "It also will give businesses insight into the thought process used by inspectors in verifying compliance."

The course is intended for meat and poultry business owners, managers and supervisors responsible for food safety systems in their plants. Topics will include sanitation performance standards and operating procedures, sampling programs and Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point procedures.

Attendees will not be able to use the course to meet certification requirements in part 417.7 of Title 9 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

the company at its Las Vegas address but representatives were evasive, and the company is not properly registered to do business in Nevada or North Carolina.

My office has taken several grants scammers to court over the past few years, shutting them down and winning money back for consumers whenever possible.

We're preparing to go to trial soon in federal court on a grant scam that

targeted lower income and older consumers. Consumers who took the bait and made initial payments were re-victimised by "grant coaching services" after they failed to secure grants on their first attempts.

Unfortunately, more grant scams are popping up, using the bad economy to try to get rich at your expense. Here's how you can avoid these scams:

Beware of anyone who promises you free or easy money in exchange for an upfront fee.

Don't be fooled by telephone calls or official-look-

ing letters that tell you you've unexpectedly won a government grant you didn't apply for, and don't give out personal information such as Social Security or bank account numbers to get a grant.

Steer clear of grant offers that claim you can use the money for anything you want. Most legitimate government grants given to individuals are for specific purposes, such as to pay for emergency repairs after a hurricane, fund research projects, start certain types of small businesses or cover college costs.

Don't fall for outfits that say they can guarantee you a grant. Legitimate grant programs are competitive, and not everyone who applies gets funding.

Be skeptical about paying for brochures or other materials that are supposed to help you win a grant.

Bucolic briefs

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Risk Management Agency reminds North Carolina livestock producers of the availability of Livestock Gross Margin insurance for dairy cattle. LGM Dairy protects against loss of gross margin (market value of milk minus feed costs) on milk produced from dairy cows. The indemnity at the end of the 11-month insurance period is the difference between the gross margin guarantee and the actual gross margin (if positive).

The policy uses futures prices for corn, soybean meal and milk to determine expected and actual gross margin, and may be tailored to any size farming operation. LGM Dairy is different from traditional options in that it is a bundled option covering the price of both milk and feed costs. Producers can sign up 12 times per year and insure up to 240,000 hundredweight per year. Although insurance purchases must be executed through insurance agents, producers may access all policy materials, including Premium Calculation Instructions, on the RMA website at www.rma.usda.gov/livestock/. Sales are made from the time of posting on the RMA website on the last business Friday of the month until 8 p.m. the following evening. LGM-Dairy sales will resume with the beginning of the 2012 fiscal year.

Advance State Fair, concert tickets on sale

The 2011 N.C. State Fair is just over a month away and fairgoers are reminded to plan ahead to save time and money. Concert tickets and discounted admission and ride tickets are on sale at www.ncstatefair.org.

"Longtime fairgoers know advance gate and ride tickets can save them a significant amount of money," said State Fair Manager Wesley Wyatt. "Plus, early shoppers can earn free tickets for purchases made before retail locations open through the Early Bird Special."

Advance admission

tickets are \$6 for adults and \$2 for children. These prices save \$2 per adult admission ticket and \$1 per child's ticket. Adult admission tickets for groups of 40 or more will cost \$5.

An 18-ticket ride sheet will cost \$10 in advance, saving fairgoers \$8 off the price of ride tickets at the gate. Children under age 6 and adults 65 and over get in free.

With the Early Bird Special, ticket buyers can earn up to three free adult admission tickets based on the total purchase amount in a single order before convenience fees. Spending

between \$40 and \$100 earns one free ticket. Purchases of \$100.01 to \$200 will earn fairgoers two free tickets, and purchases of more than \$200 earn three free tickets.

Admission, ride, grandstand and Dorton Arena concert tickets apply toward the purchase total. The Early Bird Special lasts until Sept. 28, and is good for online sales only.

owners talk to their veterinarians to determine the best time to start the vaccination process. He also recommends a booster shot of each vaccine be given every six months in North Carolina because of the extended mosquito season.

Symptoms of EEE include impaired vision, aimless wandering, head pressing, circling, inability to swallow, irregular staggering gait, paralysis, convulsions and death. Symptoms of WNV in horses can include loss of appetite and depression, fever, weakness or paralysis of hind limbs, convulsions, impaired vision or hyperexcitability.

People, horses and birds can become infected from a bite by a mosquito carrying the diseases, but there is no evidence that horses can transmit the virus to other horses, birds or people through direct contact.

Website contains info for poultry farmers affected by plant closures

Poultry farmers whose production contracts will be affected by the closing of two Townsends processing plants this fall are advised to seek information from a website set up by the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

The Growers Assistance and Information Network, or GAIN, contains information and listings of resources that could assist growers with financial planning, alternative markets and other topics relevant to their situation. The site includes contact information for resources at state and federal agencies, universities and nonprofit organizations.

It also offers a list of steps that growers can take if they find themselves without a contract.

In August, Omtron Ltd., which bought Townsends' North Carolina operations in February, announced it would close plants in Mocksville and Siler City by October. The closures are expected to put more than 1,100 people out of work and end the contracts of about 200 poultry farmers who raise chickens for the company.

"The pending closure of these plants is already having a ripple effect across the state, affecting plant workers, farmers and their communities," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "We are working with the Department of Commerce and other state and federal agencies to identify ways to minimize the impacts. In the meantime, we want growers to have as much information as possible. This website is the place to go for that information."
