NOTICE OF DENIAL OF APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF BOARDING KENNEL LICENSE

Dear Ms. Gunter:

Pursuant to the North Carolina General Statutes (N.C.G.S. §19A-30) this letter is notice of the Department's decision to deny your application for renewal of your boarding kennel license for the facility listed as addressee.

Within 30 days from the date of receipt, you must do one of the following:

1. Close your facility; or
2. File a written petition for a contested case hearing the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) appealing the denial of your license renewal application.

If you believe that your facility is in compliance with the Animal Welfare Act and the rules promulgated thereunder, you may contact the Animal Welfare Section and request reinspection. However, your request does not entitle you to operate a boarding kennel without a license and the Animal Welfare Section is not obligated to grant your request for inspection.

Additional information about your options is provided below:

APPEAL

If you file a contested case petition, it must be in writing and in the form prescribed by G.S. §150B-23. File the petition and one copy with:

Please note that the Office of Administrative Hearings now charges a filing fee of \$20.00 for petitions filed against the NCDA&CS. Further, NCDA&CS reserves the right to assess a civil penalty in the future or take other enforcement action against you if it finds that you have not filed a petition and have continued to operate an unlicensed boarding kennel past the thirty days specified above.
