NOTICE OF WARNING

We have an investigative case report showing that you violated the North Carolina Compulsory Meat Inspection Law. The reported violations were discussed with you on December 14, 2010. Specifically, our investigation revealed that you had stored, offered for sale and/or sold sixteen (16) packages of beef stew, Nam sausage, Banh Bao "steamed bun containing pork" and/or Banh Coun containing ground pork, which did not contain State (NCDA) or Federal (USDA) marks of inspection or required labeling, to the general public. In a signed statement dated December 14, 2010 you stated that you purchased the misbranded Banh Bao "steamed bun containing pork" and the Banh Coun containing ground pork from an Asian lady who lives in High Point, NC. You also stated that you purchased the misbranded beef stew and Nam sausage from another unknown Asian lady whom you did not know.

Please be advised that the sale of misbranded and/or uninspected meat products is a violation of North Carolina General Statute (N.C.G.S.) §106-549.23 with civil and/or criminal penalties. Please be advised that you will not receive any further warning with regard to this violation. If you should continue to sell misbranded and/or uninspected meat products, we will pursue legal action against you to invoke the penalties associated with these continued violations. I certainly hope this expensive action will not be necessary. An officer from this department will visit you periodically to verify compliance.
