NOTICE OF WARNING

We have an investigative case report showing that you violated the North Carolina Compulsory Meat Inspection Law. This reported violation was discussed with you on March 11, 2014. Specifically, our investigation revealed that you had processed, stored, transported, offered for sale and/or sold Fried Pork Skins (Chicharrones), which did not contain a State (N.C.D.A.) or Federal (U.S.D.A.) marks of inspection or required labeling, to Compare Foods for the sole purpose of resale to the general public. In a signed statement dated March 11, 2014 you stated that you transported and sold the Fried Pork Skins, which did not contain a State (N.C.D.A.) or Federal (U.S.D.A.) marks of inspection or required labeling, to Compare Foods (1233 University Drive, Durham, North Carolina) county inspected meat market, where the meat products were offered for sale and sold to the general public.

Please be advised that the sale of misbranded and/or non-inspected meat products is a violation of North Carolina General Statute (N.C.G.S.) §106-549.23 with civil and/or criminal penalties. Please be advised that you will not receive any further warning with regard to this violation. If you should continue to sell misbranded and/or non-inspected meat products, we will pursue legal action against you to invoke the penalties associated with these continued violations. I certainly hope this expensive action will not be necessary. An officer from this department will visit you periodically to verify compliance.
