NOTICE OF WARNING

We have an investigative case report showing that you violated the North Carolina Compulsory Meat Inspection Law. This reported violation was discussed with you on January 31, 2018. Specifically, our investigation revealed that you had stored, transported, offered for sale and sold/wholesaled misbranded lamb products to a retail store (Weaver Street Market, 101 E. Weaver Street Market, Carrboro, North Carolina 27510) for the sole purpose of resale to the general public, that were produced without the benefit of State (NCDA) or Federal (USDA) inspection. In a signed statement dated January 31, 2018, you stated that you stored, transported, offered for sale and sold/wholesaled misbranded meat products to a retail store for the sole purpose of resale to the general public for approximately one (1) day.

Please be advised that the sale of misbranded and/or non-inspected meat products and the sale of misbranded and/or non-inspected poultry products is a violation of North Carolina General Statute (N.C.G.S.) §106-549.23 and §106-549.56 with civil and/or criminal penalties. Please be advised that you will not receive any further warning with regard to this violation. If you should continue to sell misbranded and/or non-inspected meat and poultry products, we will pursue legal action against you to invoke the penalties associated with these continued violations. I certainly hope this expensive action will not be necessary. An officer from this department will visit you periodically to verify compliance.
