**NOTICE OF WARNING**

We have an investigative case report showing that you violated the North Carolina Compulsory Meat Inspection Law. This reported violation was discussed with you on January 30, 2020. Specifically, our investigation revealed that you processed, stored, transported, offered for sale and sold/wholesaled misbranded/non-inspected meat products (pickled pork mini sausages) to a retail store (Southern Charmers Country Store, 3056 Wilkesboro Highway, Statesville, NC 28625) for the sole purpose of resale to the general public. In a signed statement dated January 30, 2020, you stated that you processed, stored, transported, offered for sale and sold/wholesaled misbranded/non-inspected meat products to the general public for approximately four (4) months.

Please be advised that the sale of misbranded and/or non-inspected meat products and the sale of misbranded and/or non-inspected poultry products is a violation of North Carolina General Statute (N.C.G.S.) §106-549.23 and §106-549.56 with civil and/or criminal penalties. Please be advised that you will not receive any further warning with regard to this violation. If you should continue to sell misbranded and/or non-inspected meat and poultry products, we will pursue legal action against you to invoke the penalties associated with these continued violations. I certainly hope this expensive action will not be necessary. An officer from this department will visit you periodically to verify compliance.
