NPDES Stormwater Program

Phase I covered industry, construction (> 5 acres), & municipalities (> 100,000)

Phase II expanded to:

- Construction over 1 acre
- Smaller communities (< 100,000)

Six required components:

1. Public education
2. Public involvement
3. Illicit discharge
4. Construction site runoff
5. Post-construction site runoff controls
6. Pollution prevention of municipal facilities
