Description of damage resulting from natural disaster (include length of affected stream reach):

As a result of Hurricane Irene, trees have blown over into the drainage way and are  
blocking water flow. The area for stream debris removal begins at Hwy 158 Ditch and  
work will continue North to the headwaters in the Dismal Swamp or until all funds are  
used. The overall length of affected stream reach is 22,176 lin. Ft.

Description of economic, environmental, and social damages resulting from debris (include realistic \$ estimate of potential losses) :

The Upper Pasquotank River is the outlet drainage for approximately 8,737 acres of  
cropland and losses from agriculture, timber and personal property could easily reach  
hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Cost was determined on a per linear foot basis of \$2.00/ lin. Ft.

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Description of any state or federally listed threatened or endangered species potentially adversely impacted by the proposed action and any strategies proposed to mitigate adverse impacts:


No heavy equipment will be used in the debris removal project. A crew working from
