Due to citizens requests, the types of seedlings has
changed over the years to more ornamental tree
seedlings.



Taking orders verses first come first serve basis

Taking orders:

- Collect money upfront
- Place order for amount of seedlings needed

First come, first serve:

- Able to reach citizens that didn't want to preorder or were not aware of sale.
- Citizens are able to get small number of seedlings
- Gives them the opportunity to pick and choose the type seedlings they want on day of the sale.

Geotextile Material



TerraTex N08 is a nonwoven geotextile made up of polypropylene fibers. These fibers are needed to form a stable and durable network such that the fibers retain their relative position. It is non-biodegradable and resistant to most soil chemicals, acids and alkali with a pH range of 3 to 12. TerraTex N08 is manufactured to meet or exceed the following minimum average roll values:

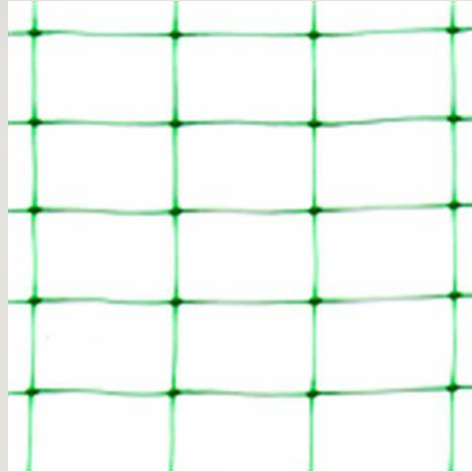
