

Become a Forest Steward

- 1. Contact a cooperating agency. (mail in response card on this brochure)
- 2. Develop a plan with help from a team of natural resource professionals or an approved natural resource consultant.
- 3. Make improvements on the ground. Begin to implement the management
- 4. Apply for Stewardship Forest Certification.
- 5. Become a Certified Forest Steward, upon approval, and gain recognition for your accomplishments.

Eligibility


