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PURPOSES OF THIS PUBLICATION

This publication was first published in 1920 following the formation of the Crop Reporting Service by the State and National Departments of Agriculture in 1919. The preparation of the copy requires so much time that only semi-annual issues have been permitted in recent years. This means that only facts worth keeping are published.

Obviously this information is used pri-

marily for analyses, program planning, locating markets for sale and purchase, and other economic purposes. Agricultural teachers, county farm agents, county officials, transportation agencies, agricultural supply houses and marketing associations are the principal users. The 1935 county acreage figures are based on the farm census survey records reported. The yields and prices are based on the thou-

sands of general and special voluntary crop reporters' judgments which are made after harvest.

In reliability, these records compare quite favorably with the United States Census acreages. At any rate, they are the best available. These data place North Carolina's agriculture on a business basis. Educationally, it encourages and aids familiarity with each county.



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
