# **North Carolina State Fair History**

## Bascom Lamar Lunsford and the Origins of the Folk Festival

Bascom Lamar Lunsford was born in Mars Hill, North Carolina, in 1882, surrounded by the rich traditions of Appalachian folk music. In 1928, he founded the Mountain Dance and Folk Festival, often recognized as the first event to be described as a "Folk Festival." His goal was to preserve and showcase the music and dance traditions of Southern Appalachia, celebrating the beauty and dignity of the region's culture.

The festival grew into the oldest gathering of its kind in the nation, highlighting the talents of artists from the Great Smoky and Blue Ridge Mountains. It played a key role in raising awareness of Southern Appalachian culture throughout the region, the nation, and even the world.

Lunsford's mission was to present the best Appalachian ballad singers, string bands, and square dance teams for both education and entertainment. The festival's music and dances reflect the diverse heritage of the region, including Scottish, English, Irish, Cherokee, and African influences.

In 1948, Lunsford helped establish the Folk Festival at the North Carolina State Fair, bringing these traditions to an even wider audience.

Gail Lyle, founder of the Little River Cloggers, continued this legacy. She danced with the Eno Valley Cloggers, who performed at the fair in 1977 and 1978. In 1995, Gail started her own team, and the Little River Cloggers have been a fixture at the state fair since 1996.

#### Expanding the Folk Festival

While the festival began as a celebration of Southern Appalachian heritage, it has grown over the years to embrace musical and dance traditions from around the world. Today, the festival highlights heritage music and dance categories representing diverse cultures, from Cajun and Zydeco to Irish step dance, Hispanic folk, and West African drumming.

To reflect evolving artistic expressions, the festival now also includes Novelty and Contemporary categories. These divisions celebrate innovative and creative performances, such as:

- Fusion genres blending folk with jazz, rock, blues, or electronic music
- Experimental dance styles and modern interpretations of traditional forms
- Comedic and theatrical performances featuring unique instruments or props

The North Carolina State Fair Folk Festival continues to honor its roots while welcoming new generations of artists and performers, creating a vibrant and inclusive celebration of music, dance, and culture.

# FOLK FESTIVAL HAS FOUR DIVISIONS:

#### HERITAGE DANCE

Clogging at the NC State Fair Folk Festival features live music and professional judging the first four day of the festival, showcasing Appalachian tradition with energy and precision.

The first four days highlight Heritage Dance, celebrating traditional styles from North Carolina and beyond, including Appalachian flatfooting, ballet, Bollywood, tango, Irish step, African and Indigenous dances, and global folk traditions. These non-judged performances focus on storytelling, technique, and cultural expression.



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#### **NOVELTY & CONTEMPORARY DANCE**

Novelty Dance showcases fun, creative, and unconventional routines, including trend-driven fads, theatrical performances, comedic interpretations, and unique movement styles. From classic dance crazes to imaginative new creations, this category embraces originality and entertainment.

Contemporary Dance is a dynamic and expressive category that fuses ballet, modern, jazz, and global influences. With an emphasis on fluidity, storytelling, and innovation, it allows dancers to push boundaries and explore new movement styles.

Bring your own music. Performance ONLY. Novelty & Contemporary Dance are not judged.

#### TRADITIONAL VOCAL AND INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

Traditional vocal and instrumental styles preserve cultural identity, storytelling, and artistic expression across generations, from Tuvan throat singing and Flamenco to West African griot storytelling and Native American powwow songs.

In North Carolina, Appalachian folk, bluegrass, gospel, and blues blend African, European, and Indigenous influences, using fiddles, banjos, and soulful harmonies to keep deep musical roots alive through folk singing, choral arrangements, and call-and-response patterns that connect the past with the present.

#### CONTEMPORARY & NOVELY VOCAL AND INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

The Contemporary and Novelty division showcases innovative and unconventional musical styles, blending modern influences with unique interpretations of traditional sounds.

Folk-jazz or electronic fusion, folk-inspired originals, novelty instrument acts, beatboxing or looping, folk song parodies, and blends with pop, rock, hip-hop, R&B, blues, jazz, acapella, or global music.

Performances are evaluated by professional judges who assess authenticity, technique, and artistic expression.

Perform solo or with recorded backing music. Live music, backed by the house band, is available upon request for performances on the 17th through the 20th.





Live Band and Professional Clogging Judges are ONLY available the 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th. Clogging performances outside of those dates will not be judged. Time slots are first come - first served. Register early to secure your place in the lineup. HERITAGE DANCE

Four or more people standing line or formation line, no facing in same line, no personal contact. Choose your Class using your groups average age. Maximum performance time 8 minutes.

# **DIVISION 106 - CLOGGING DUO/DUETS**

Male/female couple, or 2 males, or 2 females dancing as partners – do not separate from partner. Join hands as much as possible. As a couple move into a 4-corner pattern. Bluegrass or country music is required. Choose your Class using your duos average age. Maximum performance time 8 minutes.
