Seventh annual Ag Forum will focus on economic trends, farm safety Feb. 2 at State Fairgrounds

Trends affecting North Carolina's economy and agriculture will be the focus of the seventh annual Ag Development Forum Thursday, Feb. 2, at the State Fairgrounds.

Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler also will deliver his annual State of Agriculture address at the forum, which will take place from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in the Holshouser Building.

Keynote speakers will be Mike Walden and Blake Brown, agricultural economists at N.C. State University. The pair will highlight trends they expect to have an impact on the state's economy and its agricultural industry.

"The forum continues to provide participants with information we hope they can use to benefit their farms and businesses," Troxler said. "I encourage farmers, agribusiness

professionals and others interested in agricultural policy and economics to attend."

Farm safety will be the subject of a roundtable discussion featuring representatives of the state and federal labor departments, the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, N.C. State University's Department of Biological and Agricultural Engineering, and N.C. Farm Bureau.

New NCD&CS regional agronomist serving growers in Boone/Hickory/Morganton area

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services has hired Dwayne Tate as a regional agronomist to advise growers in Alexander, Alleghany, Ashe, Avery, Burke, Caldwell, Catawba, Mitchell, Watauga and Wilkes counties.

Tate is available for consultation beginning Dec. 12. He replaces Lynn Howard, who retired in June after 31 years of state service.

"We're glad to have Dwayne join our staff," said Agriculture Commissioner

Steve Troxler. "He comes to us with extensive experience in traditional mountain-area agriculture: burley tobacco, fruit and vegetable crops, Christmas trees and greenhouse tobacco float systems. He will be a valuable resource for growers in our northwestern counties."

Tate earned a bachelor's degree in agriculture from Berea College in Kentucky and has been involved in agricultural field and research studies at N.C. State University since 1982.

He served most recently as agricultural research specialist at the Mountain Horticultural Crops Research Station and Extension Center in Mills River.

Tate's work has earned him the SPA Award of Excellence from N.C. State in 2003 and the 2008 Educator of the Year Award from the N.C. Christmas Tree Association.

As regional agronomist, Tate is part of the Agronomic Division's Field Services Section. He can provide

advice on a wide range of agronomic issues, including liming, crop fertilization, nutrient management, soil testing, plant tissue analysis, use of animal wastes and composts, nematode assay, and testing of source water and nutrient solutions.

From the tractor

Efforts to trim the federal government's budget have been in the news lately, and are something that we as a state agency are watching closely because of the potential impact on our programs and services.

Some of the programs within the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services receive

grants or funding through our federal partners, and any reduction in those funds could mean we may be scrambling to continue the projects and services that we have been able to provide via this partnership.

One specific budget-cutting example we are aware of is a proposal to close the North Carolina Field Office of USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Under a proposal approved by USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack, NASS field offices across the country would be consolidated into nine regional offices. North Carolina would be served by a center in Lexington, Ky., under the proposal.

I believe the closure of this office would be a huge

loss to our state in terms of the quality and quantity of industry information collected. Right now, we have access to county-by-county statistics on crop and livestock production numbers. If the federal government moves to regional offices, only state data will be collected, and that is only if North Carolina ranks high enough in a particular commodity.

Our department's relationship with NASS dates back to 1919, and through this partnership we have been able to provide reliable and essential information to North Carolina's agricultural community. In addition, field staff have also been responsible for several special surveys that are conducted each year. The information

collected and compiled helps us better tell the story of agriculture's significant contributions to the state's economy.

I have been in contact with Senators Richard Burr and Kay Hagan about this issue, and I hope we will be able to keep a field office here.

Also on our federal radar this year are overall agricultural appropriations, the implementation of the farm bill, a number of proposed bills regarding farm labor and immigration rules, the implementation of the Food Safety Modernization Act, several Environmental Protection Agency proposals that could

The Southern/National Draft Horse Pull and Coon Mule Jump event will be held Feb. 3 at 6 p.m. in the Hunt Horse Complex at the State Fairgrounds. The show will be held in conjunction with the Southern Farm Show. Twenty teams of giant draft horses will compete for bragging rights and prize money as they pull to see who can move the most weight on a weighted sled. The competition is divided into two categories – heavyweights (above 3,300 pounds) and lightweights (less than 3,300 pounds). Teams can typically pull up to twice their weight. In the Coon Mule Jump, mules will attempt to clear the highest height from a stationary position. Some mules have been known to clear 6 feet. Tickets are \$8 in advance or \$10 at the door. impact agriculture, issues regarding crop insurance rules for fresh markets and apples, and a request for federal assistance for poultry producers affected by the closing of processing companies.

You can see there are a lot of hot-button issues at play this year. I have been to several commodity meetings this year, and already

I am hearing about the potential for labor shortages for farms. It is a major concern of producers and, quite honestly, the current program for foreign workers is not effective for farmers.

Our growers must have access to an affordable and reliable labor supply or we may find ourselves like other states, whose farmers have had to watch fruit and vegetables rot in the

fields because they cannot find workers willing or able to harvest crops. This is a national issue and if there is no federal action to fix foreign worker programs, we could all see the price of food continue to rise.

During the annual meeting of the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture, agriculture commissioners adopted several principles

with regards to reforming the guest worker program.

North Carolina apple producers have brought to my attention changes in the federal crop insurance program with regards to fresh market apples.

Because of unique weather conditions in N.C., many of the farmers would be locked out of the market for fresh market apple insurance – a product that was

supposed to help farmers in the event of a disaster.

I have just touched on a few of the many bills and issues that we will be watching closely in Congress this year. I want to be sure our farmers voices and concerns are heard and understood. I hope to talk with growers more during my visits with commodity groups during the first quarter of the year.

Prize-winning recipes from the 2011 State Fair

Roast Pork with Bacon Jam Glaze from the N.C. Pork Council contest

Jennifer Huntington of Raleigh won the top prize and \$200 for her Roast Pork with Bacon Jam Glaze in the Bacon! Tar Heel Pork Challenge at the N.C. State Fair.

Katherine Ball, Jess Jur and Paige Presler-Jur, all of Raleigh, took home \$150 and second place for their Bacon-Wrapped Shrimp and Grits Appetizer, and a Fall Pork Casserole by Mary Lou Mitchell of Raleigh won third place and \$100. Felice Bogus of Raleigh received an honorable mention and \$50 for Sizzlin' Sicilian Stuffed Pork.

Entries were judged on taste appeal, appearance, originality of recipe and ease of preparation.

The winning recipe follows:

Shrimp and Grits Quiche from the N.C. Egg Association contest

A recipe for Shrimp and Grits Quiche won the top prize and earned Gail Fuller of Raleigh \$200 in the Incredible Edible Egg Quiche Recipe Contest at the N.C. State Fair.

Entries were judged on taste, creativity, family appeal and ease of preparation. All entries included four eggs.

The winning recipe follows:

Shrimp and Grits Quiche

Crust

2 cups water
Dash of white pepper
1 tablespoon onion, dried and minced
¾ cup quick cooking grits
1 large egg, beaten

Filling

1 cup Swiss cheese, shredded	1 clove garlic, minced
1 cup cheddar cheese, shredded	2 tablespoons parsley, chopped
1 cup shrimp, coarsely chopped	1 teaspoon Old Bay Seasoning
1 cup kielbasa, thinly sliced	½ teaspoon celery seed
6 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled	4 eggs, beaten
½ cup onions, chopped	1½ cups half and half

For the crust, preheat oven to 400 degrees. In a two-quart saucepan, bring water, salt, dried onions and white pepper to a boil. Slowly stir in grits. Return to a boil. Cook for five minutes or until very thick, stirring constantly. Remove pan from heat. In a small bowl, combine a small amount of cooked grits with beaten egg. Add back into saucepan with cooked grits blending thoroughly. Spread grits mixture in bottom and up sides of a lightly greased pie plate. Bake in preheated oven for 25 to 25 minutes or until edges are lightly browned and crust is firm.

For the filling, sprinkle the bacon, shrimp, kielbasa, onion and Swiss and cheddar cheese over the crust. In a small bowl, mix eggs and half and half thoroughly. Add parsley, garlic, Old Bay seasoning, celery seed, salt and pepper. Pour cheese mixture over crust and bake 55 to 60 minutes in a 350-degree oven. Cool 5 to 10 minutes before serving.

Roast Pork with Bacon Jam Glaze

2 pounds pork loin
½ pound sliced bacon
½ cup onion, diced
2 cloves garlic, diced
2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar
¼ cup dark brown sugar, packed
¼ cup maple sugar
Salt and pepper to taste

Arrange slices of bacon on a baking sheet lined with foil. Preheat oven to 400 degrees and cook bacon for 15 minutes or until golden brown. Remove bacon from oven and drain, reserving one tablespoon to the fry onions and garlic. Pour tablespoon of bacon fat into a frying pan and add in onions, garlic and brown sugar.

Sauté on low heat for five minutes. Add the apple cider vinegar and maple syrup. Bring to a simmer and cook for 15 minutes, or until glaze begins to thicken. Transfer onion mixture and bacon to food processor and pulse until coarsely chopped.

Preheat oven to 400 degrees again. Rub salt and pepper over outside of tenderloin. Glaze with the bacon jam glaze. Bake for 25 to 35 minutes or until pork is no longer pink in the middle and a meat thermometer reads 160 degrees.

Serves six.



Thai Salad from the N.C. Peanut Growers contest

A Thai Salad by Priti Amin of Raleigh took first place and \$200 in the N.C. Peanut Growers Pea-nutty Vegetarian Recipe Contest at the N.C. State Fair.

Ann Kimberley of Cary took home second place and \$150 for a Peanut Butter Hummus recipe. Mary Boury of Knightdale won third place and a \$100 prize for her Peanut Squash Ravioli with Peanut Brown Butter Sauce. Samuel Barefoot of Benson earned an honorable mention and \$50 for Curried Peanut and Pumpkin Soup.

Entries were judged on taste and flavor, creativity, family appeal and ease of preparation.

The winning recipe follows:

Thai Salad

½ bag spring mix (Romaine lettuce, Tango and Radicchio) or ½ bag Romaine lettuce
½ bag baby spinach
6 ounces cherry tomatoes, cut into halves
1 small red onion, diced
1 avocado, diced
1 red and green pepper, cut lengthwise
½ cucumber or English cucumber, diced
½ cup plain unsalted, roasted peanuts
½ box (¾ cup) extra firm tofu, diced
½ cup edamame, steamed

Dressing

1 cup cilantro, chopped	2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
¼ cup fresh basil leaves	1 pinch of salt
½ cup olive oil	1 tablespoon honey
¼ cup red vine vinegar	1 tablespoon Parmesan cheese

Blend the dressing ingredients into a fine liquid consistency.

Mix all the salad greens in a tray and pour over the dressing. Toss well. Add the roasted peanuts and other ingredients. Toss again. Do a taste test. If you prefer a sweeter salad, add a little more honey to the dressing. If too salty or sweet, add more lime juice. Add chili flakes if you prefer a salad on the spicy side. Serve in a large salad bowl or portion out into individual bowls.


