## Four new agronomists serving agricultural interests in N.C.

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services recently announced four new agronomists and the areas they will be serving. Some agronomists had worked previously with the Agronomic Services Division, but in different regions. In addition, two service areas in the mountain counties have changed.

All North Carolina growers have access to the advisory services of the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services through a regionally based network of agronomists. Regional agronomists provide advice on crop fertilization, nutri-

ent management, lime needs, soil testing, plant tissue analysis, use of animal wastes and composts, nematode assay, and testing of source water and nutrient solutions.

Following are the agronomists and a list of their service areas.

-- Perquimans County native Adam Lassiter has been named regional agronomist serving growers in Bertie, Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Gates, Hertford, Pasquotank and Perquimans counties.

Lassiter holds associate's degrees in general agriculture and agribusiness management from N.C. State University, and bach-

elor's and master's degrees in agricultural education from N.C. A&T State University.

## From the tractor

This month I want to talk about some changes we implemented with our Agronomic Services Division at the end of 2013. This division is responsible, for among other things, processing and analyzing all the soil samples submitted by farmers and homeowners in the state.

Soil samples are an important management tool for farmers, helping them to determine what nutrients need to be added to maximize crop growth and

yields, and also to protect the environment. If you are not making use of soil sampling, I would encourage you to do so.

Each year the Agronomic Division gets flooded from December through March with soil samples. About 60 percent of the samples that come into the lab for the entire year, come in during this time.

Thousands of samples pour into the lab in Raleigh; so many that the boxes with samples line the walls and halls of the office, waiting to be processed. This influx means the processing time gets extended by up to nine weeks at times because there are simply too many samples to get to quickly.

We have worked hard to become more efficient in how we process soil samples, even using a robot that can move across rows of samples measuring pH and percent humic matter. We

also use seasonal, temporary help to assist in the processing.

Our overall goal is to get results back to farmers in time for them to be ready for the growing season. But quite frankly, it has been a challenge to meet the demand, so we have started a new process to try to help farmers get their results in time.

This December a new fee went into effect for peak-season soil samples. Soil samples are normally processed for free, but this \$4 peak-season fee was meant to encourage farmers to submit their soil samples early and lessen the winter backlog. Basically, soil samples submitted before Thanksgiving would be processed for free and those submitted after the deadline would cost \$4 per sample.

The new fee meant that an unprecedented number of samples came into the lab in No-

vember, pushing turnaround time to eight weeks at a time of year that usually has a much quicker sample time. But, because the samples came in earlier, we were still able to get results back to farmers soon enough to prepare land for the upcoming growing season.

Due to the fee and the resulting earlier workload peak, the soil lab is now processing samples within two weeks. Growers who may have been unable to sample due to wet weather, still have time to submit samples now and get results in time for planting. The peak-season fee remains in effect through March 31.

Homeowners don't face the same production timetables as farmers so we encourage them to submit samples from April

## 8,000-acre conservation project in Transylvania County moving ahead

A public-private partnership to conserve nearly 8,000 acres along the crest of the Blue Ridge Mountains in Transylvania County is making progress.

The N.C. Forest Service acquired more than 3,200 acres of working forestland and a significant section of the headwaters of the French Broad River's east fork in 2013, the NCDA&CS, The Conservation Fund and U.S. Forest Service jointly announced. The acquisition was made possible with a grant from the U.S. Forest Service's Forest Legacy Program, and state and private funding.

Located on the border of North and South Carolina, the newly protected lands will eventually become part of the prospective Headwaters State Forest.

When conserved in its entirety, the future state forest will span more than nine miles and will expand opportunities for public outdoor recreation by protecting and making publicly accessible the last privately owned section of the storied Foothills Trail. It is adjacent to more than 100,000 acres of existing conservation lands in both states and provides habitat for federally endangered plant species and other federal plant and animal species of concern.

"This project may be the last opportunity to conserve a landscape-scale portion of our beloved mountains and their precious natural resources," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "Acquisition will help to connect large swaths of ex-

isting conserved land and create wildlife corridors for bear, deer and various bird species."

Ranked seventh on the 2013 national Forest Legacy Program priority list, the future Headwaters State Forest received a \$3 million grant from the Forest Legacy Program for the state's purchase of 711 acres. The federal funding was matched by \$5.4 million in private and state funding to protect an additional 1,186 acres. Combined with the state's two additional acquisitions in 2013, a total of more than 3,200 acres of the East Fork Headwaters have been conserved.

"This Forest Legacy project is a model partnership demonstrating the importance of working together to restore and conserve working forests for future generations," said Liz Agpaoa, U.S. Forest Service regional forester.

The N.C. Forest Service plans to create a multiuse management plan that will enable the property to be sustainably managed for timber production, while allowing for a variety of public recreational uses, including hunting and hiking.

In 2011, hunters spent \$525 million and wildlife-watching participants spent \$930 million in North Carolina. The project will also protect five miles of trout streams. Trout fishing contributed \$146 million to North Carolina's economy and supported almost 2,000 jobs, according to a study conducted on behalf of the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission.

U.S. Sens. Richard Burr and

Kay Hagan and U.S. Rep. Mark Meadows supported federal appropriations for the Forest Legacy Program and the Land and Water Conservation Fund in fiscal year 2013. The Conservation Fund and the state are seeking additional Forest Legacy and LWCF funds to complete the conservation of this landscape and to ensure that the land is available for public use.

Working with the N.C. Forest Service and the Carolina Mountain Land Conservancy, The Conservation Fund began the effort to conserve East Fork Headwaters in 2010. The Conservation Fund negotiated a contract to purchase the entire 8,000 acres for the state in a bargain sale from former congressman Charles Taylor and his family.

"This is a significant step forward for the East Fork Headwaters. In less than a year, more than a third of the landscape has been conserved," said Justin Boner, The Conservation Fund's real estate director for North Carolina. "We're grateful to all of the partners for their continued commitment to this multiphase, multiyear effort that will benefit North Carolina's economy and environment for generations to come."

The conservation project is poised to make additional acquisitions in 2014. In mid-December, the project was awarded a \$2.75 million grant from the N.C. Clean Water Management Trust Fund to purchase an additional 687 acres of forestland.

through October, when there is no fee and lab turnaround time is typically two weeks or less.

Samples boxes are available at cooperative extension offices and the agronomic lab in Raleigh. Homeowners should identify areas of their property that they may want to fertilize differently, such as lawn, flower garden, vegetable garden, trees and shrubs. A different sample needs to be taken for each area. Visit the Agronomic Services website, [www.ncagr.gov/agronomi](http://www.ncagr.gov/agronomi), for information on how to collect a sample and

submit it to the lab for testing.

Again, I want to emphasize that these fees are not meant to discourage folks from taking soil samples or making use of this service, but an attempt to get these critical samples in earlier so they can be useful and effective for farmers.

I appreciate the cooperation of everyone who sent those samples in early. Thank you for helping us meet our goals in the most cost-effective way possible. We will continue to look at this program and seek ways to make improvements to benefit our residents.

## AgroTips

*Test for nematodes before planting vegetables.*

Nematodes pose a major threat to nearly all vegetable crops in all soils. Unless you intend to apply a preplant fumigant, it is a good idea to collect soil samples for nematode assay before seedlings are planted and mulched. Any steps to prevent nematode problems must be taken long before the crop is established. Chemicals are not available for managing nematodes in home gardens.

\*\*\*

*Now is the time to collect tissue samples from wheat.*

Depending on where you live, you may need to sample now (eastern counties) or wait until late March (western counties). The best time to take tissue samples is when the wheat is at Zadoks Growth Stage 30 or Feekes Stage 4-5. At these growth stages, stems are upright and tillering has stopped. To collect a sample, break wheat plants off about 1/2 inch above the ground. Each sample should consist of about two handfuls of wheat — a composite gathered from 10 to 20 areas throughout the field. Be sure to read the new wheat sampling and fertilization guidelines from NCSU.

*When growing peanuts, use agronomic tests to monitor zinc levels in the soil.*

Growers who value the prime farmland where peanuts are produced should consider using alternate sites for waste application. Peanuts are very sensitive to certain metals found in waste, particularly zinc. Soils with NCDA&CS zinc index (Zn-I) values as low as 300 can be toxic to peanuts, even though other crops can tolerate levels up to Zn-I=2000.

In some areas, soil test data for peanut land already appear to show increases in zinc levels, indicating that waste is being applied to these fields. It is important to maintain a pH of 6.0-6.5 on sites where waste is applied. Low soil pH increases the availability and toxicity of metals.

*Apply lime now if recommended by your soil report.*

By now, you should have already submitted soil samples and received your report. If lime is recommended, go ahead and apply it as soon as possible. For lawns, you may want to aerate the ground before application to maximize the ability of the lime to move into the soil profile. Liming soils to the target pH of the intended crop increases availability of plant nutrients already in the soil and supplies additional calcium and/or magnesium. Since liming can take up to 6 months to adjust pH, it is important to apply lime as far in advance of planting as possible.

and decorative items. Founded in 1988 by Graban and Neidert, Prime Lumber has been exporting since its first year in operation.
