NCDA&CS at work checking gas pumps

The price of gas never seems far from people's minds, what with prices at near-record highs and with the approach of the summer travel season when people will be filling up more often.

What's happening at the pump is also on the mind of gas pump inspectors with the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services Standards Division.

The department is responsible for ensuring that pumps are dispensing a gallon when the display reads a gallon. And consumers

are paying attention.

Jerry Butler, who oversees the gasoline and oil inspection measurement program and has been with the department for 27 years, says rising gas prices almost always equate to a rising number of consumer calls.

"I expect we will see a spike in calls as people begin traveling this summer. With gas prices where they are, people are watching the displays on the pumps closely for anything out of the ordinary," Butler said. "People are aware of the

Horse owners urged to vaccinate horses early

Heavy mosquito season expected due to warm winter

Equine owners across North Carolina are urged to discuss their annual vaccination protocol with their veterinarians to protect their animals from mosquito-borne diseases.

West Nile virus and Eastern Equine Encephalomyelitis are endemic in the state and can cause illness or death, but can be prevented with a sequence of two vaccines.

More mosquitoes are expected this year because of the warmer-than-normal winter. Officials don't know for sure if that will mean an uptick in mosquito-borne viruses or if disease transmission will start earlier in the season. However, State Veterinarian David Marshall says that common sense would dictate being extra vigilant since the diseases are so easily preventable.

"In addition to getting vaccinated earlier this year, everyone needs to be vigilant in reducing the breeding grounds for mosquitoes," Marshall said. "Take the time now to rid your yard and pasture of any standing water to reduce your risk."

The EEE and WNV vaccinations initially require two shots, 3 to 4 weeks apart, for horses, mules and donkeys that have no prior vaccination history. Neither vaccination fully protects the animal until several weeks after the second shot, so it is best to vaccinate as early in the mosquito season as possible. Marshall also recommends a booster shot of each vaccine be given every six months in North Carolina because of the extended mosquito season.

Symptoms of EEE include impaired vision, aimless wandering, head pressing, circling, inability to swallow, irregular staggering gait, paralysis, convulsions and death.

Symptoms of WNV in horses can include loss of appetite and depression, fever, weakness or paralysis of hind limbs, convulsions, impaired vision or hyperexcitability.

People, horses and birds can become infected from a bite by a mosquito carrying the diseases, but there is no evidence that horses can transmit the virus to other horses, birds or people through direct contact.

With the U.S. Department of Agriculture's release of the 2012 Prospective Plantings Report for North Carolina, we gained some insight into what farmers will likely plant this year. And like most years, some crop acres will increase, while others will decrease.

On the increasing side, peanuts are expected to be up about 22 percent this year from 2011, with farmers indicating they will plant 100,000 acres. That would be the most peanut acreage in our state since 2008.

Wheat, which was planted in the fall and winter, is also up significantly. A total of 830,000 acres of wheat was planted, a 19-percent increase.

Corn and soybean acreage also looks to be up. If projections hold true, we could be looking at 900,000 acres of corn, up 3 percent from 2011. Soybean acreage could top out at 1.43 million acres, up 4 percent.

I am sure corn producers are not looking for a repeat of 2011, which was particularly harsh to growers. Dry conditions coupled with Hurricane Irene produced yields that were 25 bushels per acre below the 10-year average.

Sweet potato farmers are also indicating they will grow 3 percent more acres in 2012.

Cotton and flue-cured tobacco are expected to see drops in acreage. No doubt, high cotton prices were behind the 800,000 acres grown in 2011. This year, that number is expected to drop down to 700,000, a 13-percent dip.

We also expected to see a 10,000-acre drop in flue-

cured tobacco. That will put production at 150,000 acres.

Planting reports such as this one are important as farmers consider what crops they want to grow for the coming season. I am hopeful that we will see a good growing season, and most especially, a season without too much hurricane activity.

As a reminder, I would like to encourage you to attend the Got to Be NC Festival May 18-20 in Raleigh. We've got plenty of fun activities for you and your family. Join us for a great day celebrating N.C. agriculture.

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Gas pumps

department's inspection sticker on the pump and can easily get the number to our office at any gas station."

There are 25 inspectors charged with inspecting each one of the nearly 121,400 pumps at 6,577 stations across the state. More than half of the inspectors also check price scanners and commercial scales for accuracy.

For the most part, inspectors find that the pumps function properly, but when there is a problem, the watchful eye of a consumer can save other shoppers money and can also alert stations to a problem they may not be aware of.

On average, approval of gas pumps runs around 90 percent, Butler said. "To date this year, we have tested 23,851 dispensers and rejected 2,336 of them, for a 90.2 percent approval rate," Butler said. "Calibration issues involving the amount of fuel dispensed tend to represent about 2 to 5 percent of the problems we find on a daily basis. The remaining problems involve faulty display lights, credit or debit card readers, tape dispensers or other items."

The gas pump inspection business has only gotten busier in the past 20 years as more and more stations are built and become operational. "I know I can look around my community and see four or five gas stations that have been added in just the past year," Butler said. "That's at least 100 more pumps that need to be checked."

NCDA&CS inspection

trucks carry certified five-gallon test cans for each grade of gas. When an inspector arrives at a pump, he will do a visual assessment of the pump, looking for the brand name of the pump manufacturer, along with the names of the gas grades available and the price per gallon.

Five gallons of gas will be pumped twice into the test can – once at a high-flow rate and once at a slow-flow rate. At five gallons, the gas pump display is compared to the test can. If the pump does not function properly, it will be tagged for recalibration or repair and will not be permitted to operate.

All gas is returned to the storage tanks once the tests have been completed.

There is a check list of items an inspector will review during the testing process. Each item being checked has something to do with the safety or accuracy of the pumps.

"The day-to-day work of our Standards Division is some of the most visible to consumers. Price-scanner inspections, checking commercial scales in places of business or inspecting gas pumps are just a few ways the department touches the lives of N.C. residents," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "I'd guess that nearly every resident comes in contact with one of these tools of commerce at least once a week, so these inspections are important to consumers' wallets."

If consumers think they have encountered a faulty pump, they can report it to the Standards Division at 919-733-3313.
