N.C. Mountain State Fair runs Sept. 11-20

Each year, thousands of visitors flock to the WNC Agricultural Center for the N.C. Mountain State Fair to celebrate the people, agriculture and traditions of Western North Carolina. This year, organizers are adding new rides, attractions and exhibits to the lineup of annual favorites.

"This year, we've brought in several new attractions," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "We've also expanded the footprint of Heritage Circle to highlight even more traditional crafters that continue to add to the region's rich culture."

Heritage Circle will feature craftspeople offering daily demonstrations, ranging from molasses making and blacksmithing to pottery and basket weaving. New exhibitors will demonstrate traditional canoe-building techniques and teach fairgoers how to dye fabrics using natural materials. Visitors will have a chance to ask artisans about their crafts and the traditions intertwined with the mountains of North Carolina. In addition, visitors can purchase unique handmade gifts from exhibitors. The midway is one of the more

popular draws for many visitors. James H. Drew Exposition will return with more than 40 rides and carnival games for the whole

family. Crowd favorites, such as the chair lift and Seattle wheel, will return along with three new family-friendly attractions. The

Balloon Ferris Wheel, a pint-sized Ferris wheel, has eight enclosed cars that rotate around a smiling sun. The Lollipop Swing, another miniature version of a popular fair attraction, will send children soaring through the air in seats attached to colorful lollipop arms. Finally, the Black Forest Fun House offers children a unique place to explore and have fun.

One of the new competitions is the Ice Cream Eating Contest, sponsored by PET and Ingles.

The contest will be held in the Davis Event Center at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 15. Anyone 5 and older attending the fair the day of the contest is eligible to participate, but space is limited. All contestants must be registered by 6 p.m. the day of the event.

The competition has five categories: ages 5-7; 8-12; 13-17; 18 and older; and celebrity. Trophies will be awarded to winners, and ribbons will be given to second- and third-place finishers in each category.

Farmers urged to have corn tested for aflatoxin

Dry weather means that farmers are harvesting their corn a little earlier this year. Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler is encouraging farmers to have their corn tested for aflatoxin to prevent contamination of feeds and food.

Aflatoxin is a byproduct of

the mold *Aspergillus flavus*, and can be harmful to both humans and livestock.

"Corn that has been harvested from areas that suffer from drought will be highly susceptible to aflatoxin," said Troxler. "Farmers in drought-stricken areas are strongly encouraged to take ad-

vantage of this testing. We have six drop-off locations at research stations across the state to make it easy for farmers to submit samples."


Some farmers may need to have corn samples tested for crop insurance or quality assurance purposes. These samples must be

submitted to a grain marketing location certified by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The tests cost \$22.20 per sample.

For insurance or quality assurance purposes, farmers must submit a 5-pound sample of shelled corn by mail, UPS or (Protect your flock, pg. 3)

From the tractor

September marks the 10-year anniversary of the creation of the Agricultural Development and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund. It's hard to believe it has been 10 years, but the trust fund

has accomplished a lot in that time. While it is good to celebrate what we have accomplished to date, our work is far from being finished.

I am grateful the N.C. General Assembly has invested \$20.5 million in the program since 2005. Because of their support, we have been able to preserve nearly 10,000 acres since 2005, and have an additional 4,358 acres under contract for easements. That translates into 115 easements on properties in 31 counties.

Preserving farmland to ensure the next generation has the natural resources it needs to produce food, fiber and fuel is a topic that comes up regularly in discussions

I have with my peers in other states.

States have so many immediate needs, it is sometimes difficult to get support for efforts that are focused on results so far down the road. But the challenge is, if we do not begin to address this issue now, we may wake up in 20 years and find that the best, most productive farmland is now under asphalt or a house.

We are blessed in North Carolina to have high quality farmland. But these lands face constant pressure from development, especially around our large cities, in our mountains and near our coast. The same natural resources and beauty that make

this a great state to live in, attracts others from outside our state to visit and even relocate.

New arrivals and a growing population demand more development, which is evidenced by new shopping centers, new subdivisions and new schools and services.

Back when I called on members of the General Assembly to create and fund the ADFPTF, we were leading the country in the numbers of farms lost, with more than 97,000 farms. In comparison, the second-closest state was Iowa with 52,000 farms lost.

Those figures were based on U.S. Department of Agriculture numbers from 1970 to 2010.

During that same period, we ranked third in the number of acres of farmland lost with 6.6 million acres.

This was a disturbing trend, and one we needed to begin to sound the alarm about. Farmland preservation remains a top priority for my administration. I would like to be able to fund more even easements and assist communities in developing voluntary ag districts. In each grant cycle, we receive far more requests than we have funding for.

In my opinion, the efforts of the trust fund could easily be doubled or tripled and we would still only be scratching the surface

of farmland preservation needs.

As our economy continues to improve, I would like to see us make an even bigger investment in farmland preservation efforts. My counterparts in Ohio and Pennsylvania are also focused on farmland preservation and their programs have enjoyed strong support.

In Ohio, from 2002 to 2014, the state reports 45,576 acres preserved through agricultural easements. Pennsylvania Gov. Tom Wolf's proposed budget for 2015-2016 seeks a \$30-million investment for agricultural easements, which would be a 9-percent increase in current funding.

I am encouraged by our efforts so far, and with the relationships we have developed

through this process. We have been able to leverage our grant funds to match funds with other programs. We also have developed cooperative relationships with our military bases, as we have found farmland meets some of the military's needs.

As we begin the trust fund's next decade, we remain committed to farmland preservation efforts, and I hope to report even greater success in the future.

The grant cycle for 2015-2016 is now open and accepting applications. The deadline for applications is 5 p.m. Dec. 19.

Highly pathogenic avian influenza alert

HPAI has been found in the wildfowl population in the United States, presenting an increased risk for poultry owners. At this time no cases have been found in North Carolina, but there have been cases in commercial and backyard flocks in the midwest.

Because of its presence, poultry owners are encouraged to watch their birds for any signs of illness and to contact a veterinarian if they find sick birds.

Growers can also contact one of four NCDA&CS regional veterinary diagnostic lab for more information. Go to www.ncagr.gov/vet/ncvdl/VetLabFacilitiesDirectory.html for contact information.

As this disease can spread by infected wildfowl, it is important to eliminate opportunities for your birds to come in contact with wild birds.

Owners are also urged to be extra mindful of biosecurity measures to prevent the spread of this disease.

Some practices include quarantining any new poultry additions from your existing flock for two to three weeks to observe for signs of sickness, have a dedicated pair of shoes and clothing for working with birds that stay on your property, be mindful if driving onto property with poultry as the disease can spread by vehicles. New tobacco contest offered at the N.C. State Fair

Deadline to enter is Sept. 28

The N.C. State Fair is offering a new flue-cured-tobacco-themed competition this year with a traditional twist, so if you are a tobacco farmer and want a chance to earn prize money, colorful ribbons and bragging rights, keep reading.

The Heritage Tobacco Harvest Competition will offer first-, second- and third-place prizes for silver-dollar sized hand ties of tobacco for lugs/primings, cutters, leaf, tips and whole stalk (one hand from each stalk position.)

First place is \$250, second is \$150 and third is \$100. There will also be a Commissioner's Award selected, with the winner receiving \$500.

Exhibitors must be 18 years of age or older and be North Carolina residents. The competition is open to North Carolina-grown, flue-cured tobacco only, and entries must be from individual ex-

hibitors, not teams or farm submissions. Judging will be based on the best tobacco for each stalk position and not on the quality of the tying technique. Exhibitors are limited to three entries per category, and entries must be submitted separately for each category.

Entry forms must be received by Sept. 28 in order to participate in the competition. Tobacco entries can be dropped off Oct. 10-12 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Heritage Circle Tobacco Barn at the State Fairgrounds. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Constable Laboratory, 4000 Reedy Creek Road in Raleigh. This Laboratory is not on the Risk Management Agency's approved testing facility list; therefore, results from this location will not be accepted for insurance claims.

Farmers may drop off 5-pound samples of shelled corn at the Constable Laboratory or at one of six agricultural research stations.
