Event runs Sept. 7-16 in Fletcher

The 2018 N.C. Mountain State Fair returns for its 25th run at the WNC Ag Center in Fletcher, Sept. 7-16. Fair organizers have added new attractions and entertainment options to the list of fan favorites for the fair's silver anniversary.

"This year, we wanted to put a special emphasis on music and agriculture, two of the things that make Western North Carolina such a wonderful place to live," said fair manager Matt Buchanan. "We've expanded our Mountain Music Festival in Heritage Circle, which includes an all-new event on Sunday afternoons. We've also added a new interactive exhibit all about North Carolina agriculture in the Davis Event Center."

Eleven stores pay fines for price-scanning errors

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Standards Division recently collected fines from stores in Columbus, Dare, Duplin, Hoke, Orange, Pender, Rockingham, Scotland and Wake counties.

"Stores have a responsibility to make sure the price on the shelf matches the price that's scanned at the register, and most stores pass inspection," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "Ones that don't are fined until

they come into compliance. Consumers who would like to file a complaint about scanner errors can call the Standards Division at 919-707-3225."

The department conducts periodic, unannounced inspections of a business' price-scanner system to check for accuracy between the prices advertised and the prices that ring up at the register. If a store has more than a 2-percent error rate on overcharges, inspectors discuss the findings with the store manager and conduct a

more intensive follow-up inspection at a later date. Undercharges are also reported, but do not count against a store.

Penalties are assessed if a store fails a follow-up inspection. In addition to the penalties paid, the store will be subject to re-inspection every 60 days from the last inspection until it meets the 2-percent-or-less error rate. Additional penalties may be assessed if the store fails a re-inspection. Following are stores that paid civil penalties in the second quar-

ter of 2018:

-- (Columbus) KJ's IGA #4093 at 604 Jefferson St., Whiteville, agreed to pay \$2,415 in penalties. An initial inspection in December found an error rate of 7 percent based on seven overcharges in a 100-item lot. A second inspection in January found an error rate of 2.33 percent based on seven overcharges in a 300-item lot. The store passed inspection in March.

From the tractor



Commissioner Troxler

Recently the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services hosted our 14th annual Food Safety Forum at the State Fairgrounds in Raleigh. A primary focus of this year's forum was the On-Farm Readiness Reviews (OFRR) for produce farmers, to help them get ready for compliance with the Produce Safety Rule part of the Food Safety and Manufacturing Act (FSMA).

We have been talking about FSMA and the changes it would

bring at the farm level for several years. These changes will represent the most sweeping regulatory changes in more than 70 years and the first time inspectors will be inspecting on farm. Our state has been an integral part of the conversation about how FSMA will be implemented and how On-Farm Readiness Reviews will help get our farmers ready.

I believe these reviews offer a chance to educate farmers and inspectors. They are the best way to gain compliance.

Farmers are used to 3rd party audits and GAP inspections – they are nothing new. But I know as a farmer it's a lot easier to be compliant when I understand the changes that need making as well as the why and the how behind them.

I can relate to inspectors coming on my farm and think they have the deed to it and not me. I hope these OFRR reviews will

result in increased conversation between the farmer and the inspector.

We had the opportunity to take a group of national and state agricultural officials, retail buyers and university staff to Jackson Farming Company in Autryville the day before the Food Safety Forum. At Jackson's farm we participated in an On-Farm Readiness Review demonstration lead by Dr. Chris Gunter and Dr. Lynette Johnston from N.C. State University.

The OFRR covers all aspects of the farm from field conditions, packing house, storage and transportation. We focused the demonstration on health and hygiene and the cantaloupe side of the packing house.

Jackson Farming Company is a diverse operation growing sweet potatoes, cantaloupe, watermelon, honeydew, soybeans, corn, peanuts and broccoli. Some

of these are covered under the new Produce Safety rule, others are not.

We listened as Chris and Lynette established a friendly walk-around dialogue with Heather Register, food safety coordinator with Jackson Farming Company. Questions included worker training, check-in procedures, what the protocol is if a worker gets sick on the job, how often are portable toilets in the field inspected, how often are water sources tested, what is your cleaning procedures for the packing house, how often do employees go through training and more.

We have been supporting and working towards On-Farm Readiness Reviews for a couple of years. The demonstration at Jackson Farming Company showed that this process can be

A third inspection in May found an error rate of 4 percent based on 12 overcharges in a 300-item lot. The store paid \$1,565 in penalties and will be re-

inspected.

(Hoke) Dollar General #6344 at 147 Davis Bridge Road, Raeford, agreed to pay \$355 in penalties. An initial inspection in March found an error rate of 7 percent based on seven overcharges in a 100-item lot. A second inspection in April found an error rate of 2.67 percent based on eight overcharges in a 300-item lot. The store passed inspection in June.

(Orange) Dollar General #11584 at 110 Rebecca Drive, Hillsborough, agreed to pay \$540 in penalties. An initial inspection in April found an error rate of 8 percent based on four overcharges in a 50-item lot. A second inspection in May found an error rate of 3.33 percent based on 10 overcharges in a 300-item lot. The store will be re-inspected.

(Pender) Dollar General #2767 at 105 U.S. Highway 117, Burgaw, agreed to pay a total of

\$2,445 in penalties. An initial inspection in February found an error rate of 6 percent, based on three overcharges in a 50-item lot. A second inspection in March found an error rate of 2.33 percent based on seven overcharges in a 300-item lot. The store paid \$670 in penalties at the time. A third inspection found an error rate of 5.33 percent based on 16 overcharges in a 300-item lot. The store paid \$1,775 in penalties and will be re-inspected.

(Pender) CVS #2548 at 13461 N.C. Highway 50, Surf City, paid \$795 in penalties. An initial inspection in April found an error rate of 4 percent based on four overcharges in a 100-item lot. A second inspection in May found an error rate of 2.67 percent based on eight overcharges in a 300-item lot. The store will be re-inspected. (See Scanner errors on pg. 8)

Sweet potato weevil quarantine in place for counties in SC

The North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services has established Berkeley and Jasper counties in South Carolina as quarantine areas for the sweet potato weevil after the highly destructive pest was trapped on wild morning glory by South Carolina regulatory officials. The quarantine is effective immediately.

Under the quarantine, the movement of certain sweet potato-related articles from

Berkeley and Jasper counties in South Carolina is prohibited or regulated. This includes sweet potato roots, potatoes and plants including ornamental sweet potato plants, sweet potato vines, and vines or roots of other plants belonging to the morning glory family.

Sweet potato weevils are generally considered the most serious threat to this crop, inflicting damage to plants and tubers alike.

“North Carolina is the number

one producer of sweet potatoes in the country, generating more than \$198 million in farm receipts annually, so our sweet potatoes farmers stand to lose a great deal if this weevil spreads into non-infected areas,” said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. “Establishing a quarantine where we know this pest exists is the best bet to halt its movement.”

NCDCA&CS has an extensive trapping program in place to detect the presence of this pest as

quickly as possible within North Carolina, said Phil Wilson, director of the NCDCA&CS Plant Industry Division. Traps are placed in sweet potato fields each year with a minimum of two traps on each field at a rate of one trap per 10 acres and they are monitored throughout the growing season. Staff also conduct inspections in storage and processing facilities, greenhouses and micro propagation sites.

“We continue to work with our

South Carolina counterparts to ensure sweet potato weevil or regulated articles are not moved in North Carolina from these new positive counties” Wilson said.

successful in getting our farmers ready.

I wanted to share with you some of the insights from this demonstration and the follow-up panel at the Food Safety Forum.

The OFRR is a conversation between the grower and the reviewer. The purpose is

the familiarize the grower with Produce Safety rule requirements and highlight areas where the rules would require additional assessment.

The OFRR is NOT an inspection. The assessor is not there to quiz you about your operation, but rather to help you take a comprehensive look at your farming operations in light of Produce

Safety Rule requirements.

The OFRR are confidential, non-regulatory and voluntary. What happens on the farm stays on the farm. All notes and other records will be given directly to the farmer.

GAP certification is not a substitute for the inspections required under the Produce Safety Rule.

Food safety is an agricultural

and economic issue, that starts at the farm level. I know our farmers want to do this right. I am a firm believer in educate before regulate and if you are a produce grower then I encourage you to participate in the free, volun-

tary and confidential On-Farm Readiness Review.
