

#### **Program Updates**

#### As of May 7, 2025:

- FY22 Contracts:
  - 720.5 miles of work completed
  - \$31,363,742.44 paid in reimbursements
  - 87 contracts closed out, 23 ongoing
- FY24 Contracts:
  - 90.4 miles of work completed
  - \$3,316,272.26 paid in reimbursements
  - 8 contracts closed out, 98 in effect
    - 1 Contract still pending acceptance
    - 1 contract declined.







- 23 FY22 StRAP grantees have ongoing projects.
  - 14 in Helene-affected counties.
- Grantees have requested permission to use their remaining funds (initially allocated for stream debris removal) for streambank stabilization and other eligible project types as necessary following Hurricane Helene.
  - All proposed work would fall under the umbrella of projects allowable under StRAP. At this time, proposed work is all streambank stabilization.
- Need for changing project type:
  - Streambank stabilization is higher priority.
  - FEMA/USACE/other funding sources are covering majority of needed stream debris removal.

- Grantees that have expressed interest in using funds for bank stabilization:
  - Madison SWCD
    - \$151,773 in FY22 funds remaining
    - Madison county has a \$30 million contract with Southern Disaster Recovery for waterway debris removal. Also anticipate submitting requests for funding through EWP. We are anticipating waterway debris removal to be underway and wellfunded for the next two years.
  - Macon SWCD
    - \$85,076 in FY22 funds remaining
    - 2 potential streambank stabilization sites, affecting a greenway and site of new high school. Majority of debris removal being covered by FEMA/USACE.
  - Buncombe SWCD
    - \$336,659 in FY22 funds remaining
    - USACE & EWP anticipated to cover stream debris removal needs, but county has an "endless need" for streambank stabilization.
