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Aquaculture or fish farming as it is more commonly known, has been around since the 5th century BC and began in China. Some even suggest Egyptians were once involved with aquaculture. In addition to this, it is well known that Romans were adept at farming oysters. While modern aquaculture has changed considerably since its beginnings, one thing remains the same: aquaculture is the farming of aquatic organisms. North Carolina is a diverse state where various species of fish and shellfish are cultured. Aquaculture in NC occurs in the mountains, piedmont, coastal plain, and on the coast contributing over \$55 million to the state's economy.

Mountain trout is the predominant species farmed in the western part of our state. North Carolina consistently is in the top three in the nation in the production of trout. The pristine cool mountain waters of western NC provide the water to produce high quality rainbow trout. The trout industry in North Carolina is a vital part of the mountain economy. NC has approximately 90 businesses that are involved in trout production, processing, or trout fee fishing operations. These businesses combined to contribute just over \$14 million to the western NC economy in 2007.



In the central part of NC, water is more limited. Fish farms in this part of the state are generally indoor systems made up of large tanks. These systems are very versatile in the types of fish that can be raised in them. The predominant species grown in tank systems in NC is tilapia. Most of the tilapia produced in NC were shipped and sold to ethnic markets in the northeast portion of the country where farmers can receive a premium price for their fish.


Fish farming is most prevalent in the eastern part of the state. Here, aquaculturists are blessed with abundant high quality water from aquifers deep underground. In this area of North Carolina, fish are grown in outdoor ponds.



In 2007 the catfish industry contributed over \$25 million to the state's economy, or almost half of the total aquaculture impact on the state economy. The coastal plain is also home to a second significant species, the hybrid striped bass. The first pond raised hybrid striped bass in the country were produced in NC. This fish continues to play an important role in NC aquaculture. NC is also home to hatcheries that ship fish to farms in and outside of NC to be raised on other farms. Their combined impact on the economy of eastern North Carolina was \$9 million in 2007.

In addition to the species grown on land in North Carolina, oysters and clams are also grown underwater on sound bottoms leased from the state. NC has over 1800 acres leased and planted with clams and oysters. These farmers produce almost

5000 bushels of clams and over 9000 bushels of oysters from the high quality marine waters of North Carolina providing over \$500,000 to the watermen of eastern NC.



North Carolina aquaculturists also produce many other species that contribute to our state's economy including crawfish, yellow perch, eels, and an up-and-coming freshwater prawn industry. In addition, NC aquaculture farms also produce fish for more than just food for human consumption. These include the ornamentals, koi and goldfish, pond stocking species, largemouth bass and bluegill, and lastly baitfish such as fathead minnows and golden shiners.

In a commitment to further expand the aquaculture industry in NC, research is being done to grow non-traditional species. NC currently is home to one commercial flounder hatchery with a flounder grow out facility under construction. Plans are also underway for the construction of a facility to grow black seabass. In the western part of NC a sturgeon facility has been constructed for the purpose of caviar production.

There are also several organizations in our state which help promote aquaculture and aquaculture products, the first of which is the North Carolina Aquaculture Association. This producer-led non profit organization was started to help strengthen the NC Aquaculture industry by providing a unified voice for the industry. In the past, representatives from the

NC Aquaculture Association have made presentations to the NC General Assembly and have funded projects to benefit the industry. NCDA&CS's Marketing Division is home to a full time Seafood and Aquaculture Marketing Specialist. Through the "Freshness from NC Waters" and "Got To Be NC" programs, this specialist helps NC producers promote their products not only in the state, but nationwide and even worldwide. Finally, each year through cooperation between North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, North Carolina State University, NC Sea Grant and NC Farm Bureau the NC Aquaculture Development Conference is held. For over the last 20 years this conference has served as a starting point for prospective fish farmers and provided current scientific-based information for aquaculturists in North Carolina and the surrounding states. The conference routinely brings in aquaculture experts from around the country to speak on the latest pressing issues for the NC aquaculture industry. Through the effort of these organizations, aquaculture is and continues to be a viable, environmentally friendly addition to traditional farming in NC.

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STATISTICS PROGRAM

The North Carolina Field Office of USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service compiles current and historic statistics concerning agriculture in the State. Where possible, information most often requested by farmers, the general public, and workers in government agencies are included.

Reporting of crop and livestock statistics is a service provided to farmers and others in the State by the National Agricultural Statistics Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture in cooperation with the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

The collection and dissemination of agricultural statistics had its start in 1863. This is one of the oldest activities of the United States Department of Agriculture. It was recognized that there were many advantages of a joint relationship between the State and Federal Governments in the development of agricultural statistics. Thus, in 1919 the N.C. Department of Agriculture

entered into a cooperative agreement with the U.S. Department of Agriculture to provide detailed agricultural statistics. The agreement resulted in the creation of the Agricultural Statistics Division of the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

The North Carolina Field Office of USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service publishes official statistics on crops, livestock, prices, and various other agricultural items. The most important reports and the approximate dates of releases are shown in the table below. The reports marked with an (*) are issued separately and are only available at www.ncagr.com/stats. 

2007 WEATHER & CROPS SUMMARY

The worst drought year on record for North Carolina was 2007. Of the 100 counties, 85 were declared disaster areas by the USDA. At the peak of the drought, October, 23, 2007, there were 72 counties classified with exceptional drought, 17 with extreme drought, and 11 with severe drought. The definitions of these drought categories can be found at www.ncdrought.org.

Average precipitation and abnormally warm temperatures were common during the early part of 2007. The month of April delivered below average temperatures and two early freeze events. This resulted in widespread damage to both peach and apple orchards. Many areas in the state were recording precipitation below normal. However the soil moisture remained adequate. In May, indications were beginning to show more areas of North Carolina with soil moisture levels rating poor and very poor. By the first week of May, corn was 97% planted, compared to 96% the previous year and 89% for the 5-year average. June and July had adequate rainfall most weeks and some of the small grains were progressing faster than the 5 year average. On the week ending July 1, wheat was 93% harvested compared to 83% the previous year and 84% for the 5-year average.


Hot and dry conditions extended from August until late October. Due to the dry and hot weather, phenological conditions for corn, cotton, and soybeans were above the five year average. By early September, the percentage of cotton bolls opening was 73% compared to 39% the previous year and 46% for the 5-year average. Precipitation the third week of October showed the state with 70% of the topsoil moisture rated as very short, 28% short and 2% adequate. Because of lack of precipitation and pastures not supplying enough forage, cattle farmers had to supplement feedings with hay. The last week of October offered a small amount of relief to farmers. The harvesting of cotton was completed by early December with 95% complete by November 25. This compared to 80% the previous year and 82% for the 5 year average. Most small grains were planted by early-December with wheat at 95% planted the week ending on December 9. The last weeks of December were seasonally warm in contrast to the abnormally low temperatures experienced during the first week of 2008.



The USDA, Economic Research Service (ERS) uses USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) estimates to develop state level cash receipts. The county level cash receipts in this publication are based on the ERS state level cash receipts and various county data. To ensure respondent confidentiality, estimates at any level, including county estimates, are not published if those estimates would disclose any information about individual operations. 






Monthly Price Received for Corn

(Dollars per bushel)




Monthly Price Received for Cotton

(Dollars per pound)




Monthly Price Received for Soybeans


















Top Blueberry Counties


